Assessment conducted through phone calls with key informants

The purpose of the Event Tracking Tool is to gather and provide up-to-date information on population movement events related to COVID-19. This report presents information on individuals who are confined in localities of **two southern regions of Chad, after they entered Chad coming from Cameroon.**

### EVENT: MASSIVE CONFINEMENT



**AFFECTED POPULATION:** About 1,400 persons confined for health screenings upon their arrival from Cameroon



**POINTS OF ENTRY (POEs):** Léré and Koutéré



**STATUS OF POEs:** Partially closed



**MEDICAL MEASURES IN PLACE:** Temperature screening at POEs, no specific measure in confinement areas



**DATE OF EVENT:** The confinement begun on 23 March 2020 and continues with arrivals



**SETTLEMENT TYPE:** School and hotel



**TRANSPORTATION MODE:** On foot and by car

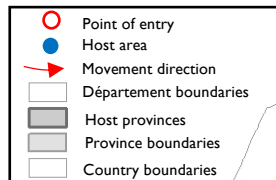
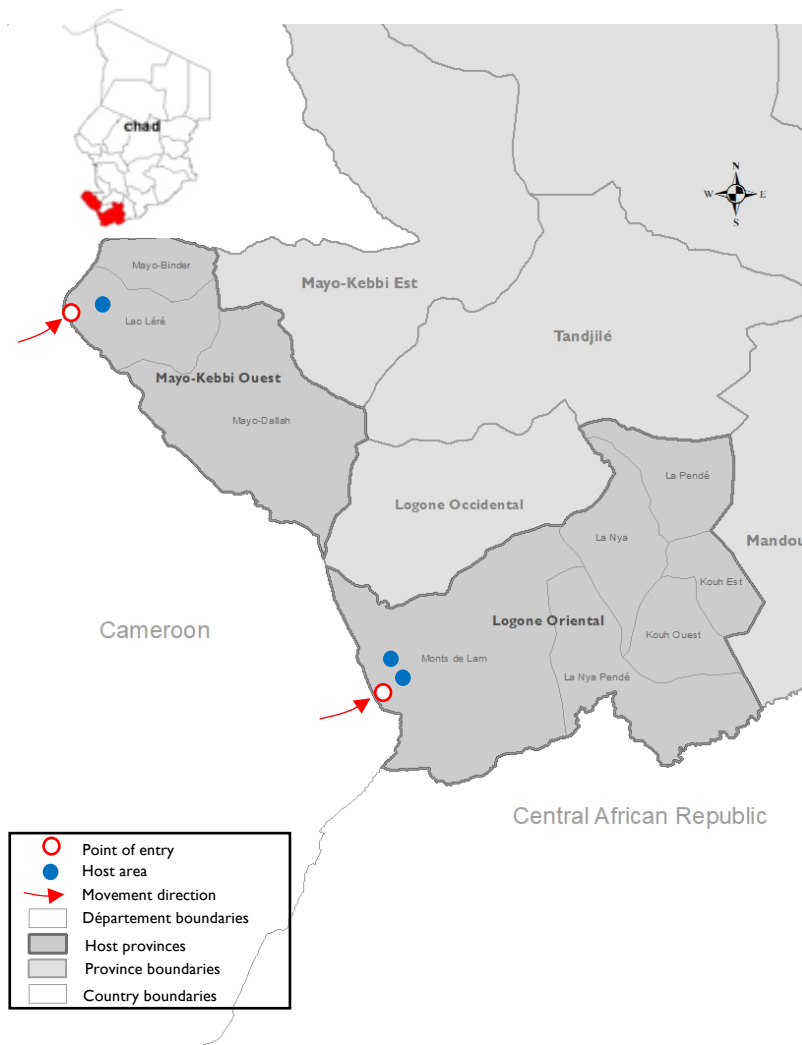
Approximately **1,300 persons** are confined in **two schools in the sous-préfecture of Larmanaye** (Département de Monts de Lam in the Province of Logone Oriental) and **100 persons in a hotel in the sous-préfecture of Léré** (Département de Lac Léré in the Mayo-Kebbi Ouest Province).

These persons are Chadian nationals, most of whom were studying in Cameroon and who have returned to Chad, **passing through Koutéré** in the Province of Logone Oriental and **Léré** in the Province of Mayo-Kebbi Ouest, after the COVID-19 related measures taken by the Cameroonian State, including the temporary closure of universities.

These people were placed under confinement by the Chadian authorities when they entered Chad and physical access to them is prohibited. Based on discussions with key informants, these people are most in need of **food, water and sleeping materials.**

In addition, it should be noted that there is a risk of spreading COVID-19 between these persons because they are confined together.

These movements of Chadian nationals returning to Chad from Cameroon will probably continue, especially since Cameroon is a country where, for several years, a significant number of Chadians have been carrying out their higher education.
