SUMMARY OF EVENT



Following their deportation from Libya, 37 individuals arrived in the town of Ounianga Kébir (Ennedi-Ouest Province), on 21 April 2020. Upon arrival, these individuals were quarantined, in line with preventive measures taken by Chadian authorities in order to prevent and contain the spread of COVID-19. It should be noted that 127 individuals are already confined at this location (see ETT-COVID report #4). Thus, in total, 164 individuals are currently quarantined in the town of Ounianga Kébir. It should be noted that 34 of them declared that they were not Chadian nationals.


