### EMERGENCY EVENT TRACKING, Um Hajaleej village, North Darfur

The DTM Emergency Event Tracking (EET) is deployed to track sudden displacement and population movements, provide more frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the new Mobility Tracking methodology in Sudan (Round Zero), and activated on a need basis, EET utilises a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population

presence per location - a useful tool for humanitarian response planning and design.

### **Event Overview**



750 Affected individuals



DTM teams activated EET to monitor the population affected by a fire that broke out in Um Hajaleej village near El Fasher, North Darfur on 25 April 2020. This EET update estimates that a total number of 150 houses were burned down out of 600 in Um Hajaleej village, affecting 750 individuals who are currently situated in open area gathering points. The cause of the fire is unknown and resulted in eight injuries and one death. All 750 affected individuals reported a substantial loss of personal and household items as well as livestock.

#### **Needs**

Data collected on priority needs indicated emergency shelter as the first priority, followed by non-food items (NFIs), food, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) and health (medical needs).













# **Demographics** 60+ Years 18 to 59 Years 6 to 17 Years 0 to 5 Years
