


A total of 1,594 movements were recorded, comprising 1,289 arrivals and 305 departures, between 29 June and 5 July 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Fufore, Gombi, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Gwoza and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno; Gombi, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Mubi North, Numan, Song and Yola North LGAs of Adamawa.



ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: poor living conditions (38%), voluntary relocation (30%), conflict/attack (21%), improved security (10%), and military operations (1%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Gubio: 340 arrivals were recorded in Gubio LGA of Borno state. All arrivals were from Felo ward of Gubio LGA in Borno state. All movements recorded were triggered by conflict/attack.

Monguno: 175 arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 134 from Kukawa ward and 24 from Alagarno ward of Kukawa LGA in Borno state and 17 from Diffa region in Niger Republic. 90 per cent of the movements were as a result of poor living conditions and 10 per cent were as a result of military operations.

Mobbar: 141 arrivals were recorded in Mobbar LGA of Borno state. All 141 arrivals were from Diffa region in Niger Republic. All movements recorded were as a result of poor living conditions.

Askira/Uba: 40 arrivals and 80 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 20 from Damboa LGA and 5 from Askira/Uba LGA in Borno state, 10 from Girei LGA and 5 from Hong LGA in Adamawa state. All departures recorded were from Gatamarwa ward of Chibok LGA in Borno state. 71 per cent of the movement were triggered by improved security, 21 per cent from poor living conditions and 8 per cent relocated voluntarily.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 112 children of 6-59 months. Of the 112 children screened, the MUAC reading was 3 children (2 from In-accessible and 1 accessible areas) in the Red category, 8 were in the Yellow category and 101 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 78 children from neighboring countries (5 in Bama, 13 in Gwoza, 35 in Mobbar and 25 in Ngala). Of all the 78 children measured, 1 child was recorded in the Red category, 69 in the Green category and the remaining 8 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
