DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and provide up-to-date information on sudden displacement and other population movements



A total of 2,096 movements were recorded, comprising 1,826 arrivals and 270 departures, between 13 and 19 July 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Hawul, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Fufore, Gombi, Guyuk, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.


Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Damboa, Gwoza, Hawul, Kala/Balge and Konduga LGAs of Borno; Fufore, Gombi, Lamurde, Madagali, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: conflict/attack (35%), poor living conditions (28%), voluntary relocation (16%), fear of attack (14%) and improved security (7%).





### Affected Population

## SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

**Mobbar:** 594 arrivals were recorded in Mobbar LGA of Borno state. All 594 arrivals were from Diffa region in Niger Republic. All movements recorded were triggered by conflict/attack.

**Guyuk:** 225 arrivals were recorded in Guyuk LGA of Adamawa state. All 225 arrivals recorded were from Dumna ward of Guyuk LGA in Adamawa state. 97 per cent of the movements were as a result of fear of attack and 3 per cent were as a result of poor living conditions.

**Gwoza:** 162 arrivals and 10 departures were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 55 from Marwa region of Cameroon, 41 from Gwoza, 26 from Ngala, 22 from Bama and 5 from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGAs in Borno state, 7 from Akko LGA in Gombe state and 6 from Maiha and Yola South LGAs in Adamawa state. All departures recorded were from Jere LGA in Borno state. 79 per cent of the movements were as a result of poor living conditions and 21 per cent relocated voluntarily.

**Askira/Uba:** 31 arrivals and 13 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 83 from Askira/Uba LGA in Borno state, 41 from Mubi South LGA and 7 from Hong LGA in Adamawa state. All departures recorded were from Askira/Uba LGA in Borno state. 45 per cent of the movements were triggered by conflict/attack, 28 per cent due to poor living conditions, 22 per cent from fear of attack and 5 per cent as a result of improved security.

## NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 239 children of 6-59 months. Of the 239 children screened, the MUAC reading was 5 children (accessible areas) in the Red category, 35 were in the Yellow category and 199 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 170 children from neighboring countries (14 in Bama, 6 in Gwoza, 148 in Mobbar and 2 in Ngala). Of all the 170 children measured, 5 children were recorded in the Red category, 135 in the Green category and the remaining 30 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
