



A total of 2,005 movements were recorded, comprising 1,708 arrivals and 297 departures, between 24 and 30 August 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Dikwa, Gubio, Gwoza, Jere, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Dikwa and Kala/Balge LGAs of Borno; Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (65.1%), poor living conditions (16.9%), improved security (8.5%), conflict/attack (7.8%) and fear of attack (1.6%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Mobbar: 615 arrivals were recorded in Mobbar LGA of Borno state. All 615 arrivals were from Diffa region in Niger Republic. All movements were as a result of voluntary relocation.

Gwoza: 207 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 76 from Konduga and 69 from Gwoza LGAs of Borno state, 24 from Girei and 5 from Gombi LGAs of Adamawa state and 33 from Marwa region in Cameroon. 52 per cent relocated as a result of poor living conditions and the remaining 48 per cent relocated voluntarily.

Gubio: 133 arrivals were recorded in Gubio LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 107 from Gubio and 26 from Magumeri LGAs of Borno state. 53 per cent of the movements were as a result of poor living conditions and 47 per cent of the movements were triggered by conflict/attack.

Gombi: 85 arrivals and 24 departures were recorded in Gombi LGA of Adamawa state. The arrivals included 25 from Hawul, 20 from Shelleng, 14 from Maiha and 11 from Zing LGAs of Adamawa state, 15 from Damboa LGA of Borno state. All departures were from Numan LGA of Adamawa state. 87 per cent relocated voluntarily and the remaining 13 per cent relocated as a result of poor living conditions.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 221 children of 6-59 months. Of the 221 children screened, the MUAC reading was 5 children (2 from In-Accessible and 3 from Accessible areas) in the Red category, 29 were in the Yellow category and 187 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 163 children from neighboring countries (1 in Bama, 9 in Gwoza, 139 in Mobbar and 14 in Ngala). Of all the 163 children measured, 3 children was recorded in the Red category, 134 in the Green category and the remaining 26 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
