
OVERVIEW

The crisis in Nigeria's North Central and North West zones, which involves long-standing tensions between ethnic and linguistic groups; attacks by criminal groups; and banditry/hirabah (such as kidnapping and grand larceny along major highways) led to fresh wave of population displacement.



Latest attacks affected 400 individuals, including 8 injuries and 1 fatality, in Charanchi, Sabuwa LGAs of Katsina State and Zagon Kataf LGA of Kaduna State between 07 - 13 September 2020. The attacks caused people to flee to neighboring localities. Also, 1,710 Individuals were displaced due to flooding in Zamfara State from heavy rain-falls that occurred during the reporting period.

A rapid assessment was conducted by field staff to assess the impact on people and immediate needs.
