DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and provide up-to-date information on sudden displacement and other population movements




A total of 1,210 movements were recorded, comprising 931 arrivals and 279 departures, between 28 September and 04 October 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Dikwa, Gwoza, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan and Song LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba and Hawul LGAs of Borno; Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Numan and Song LGAs of Adamawa.



ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (54.4%), poor living conditions (30.5%), improved security (12.0%) conflict/attack (1.6%) and fear of attack (1.6%).

## SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

**Ngala:** 147 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno state. All 147 arrivals were from Marwa region in Cameroon. All movements were as a result of voluntary relocation.

**Bama:** 138 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 108 from Bama LGA of Borno state, 11 from Mubi North LGA of Adamawa state and 19 from Marwa region in Cameroon. 78 per cent relocated as a result of poor living conditions and the remaining 22 per cent relocated voluntarily.

**Hong:** 88 arrivals and 19 departures were recorded in Hong LGA of Adamawa state. The arrivals included 40 from Maiha, 24 from Mubi South, 14 from Hong and 10 from Mubi North LGAs of Adamawa state. All departures were from Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state. 82 per cent of the movements were voluntary and 18 per cent as a result of improved security.

**Mubi North:** 29 arrivals and 64 departures were recorded in Mubi North LGA of Adamawa state. The arrivals included 18 from Mubi North and 11 from Gombi LGAs of Adamawa state. The departures included 28 from Hong, 27 from Maiha and 9 from Mubi South LGAs of Adamawa state. 62 per cent relocated voluntarily and the remaining 38 per cent relocated as a result of poor living conditions.

## NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 88 children of 6-59 months. Of the 88 children screened, the MUAC reading was 10 children (8 from In-Accessible and 2 from Accessible areas) in the Red category, 4 were in the Yellow category and 74 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 4 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 34 children from neighboring countries (7 in Bama, 3 in Gwoza and 24 in Ngala). Of all the 34 children measured, none was recorded in the Red category, 33 in the Green category and the remaining 1 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
