

## STRANDED MIGRANTS IN DJIBOUTI AS OF 8 OCTOBER 2020



Following the border closure in Ethiopia and due to the stricter border management policies in Yemen, some of the migrants who were transiting through Djibouti on their way to or from the Arabian Peninsula found themselves stranded in the country. These migrants live in spontaneous sites located along the migration corridor.

The Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), through its field enumerator teams and key informants, collects data on a daily basis at migrant sites across the country.

All reported migrants are Ethiopian nationals.

*NOTE: This data does not include Djibouti City. The estimation of the distribution of migrants by sex is based on the data collected since April 2020.*

## RETURNS FROM YEMEN BETWEEN 1 AND 8 OCTOBER 2020



From 1 to 8 October 2020, 161 migrants from Yemen (14 female and 147 male) arrived at Obock coast. Since May 2020, a total of 3,334 migrants (590 female and 2,744 male) returning from Yemen have been recorded mainly between Moulhoulé and Ras Bir.
