

STRANDED MIGRANTS IN DJIBOUTI AS OF 31 OCTOBER 2020



Following the border closure in Ethiopia and due to the stricter border management policies in Yemen, some of the migrants who were transiting through Djibouti on their way to or from the Arabian Peninsula found themselves stranded in the country. These migrants live in spontaneous sites located along the migration corridor.


The Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), through its field enumerator teams and key informants, collects data on a daily basis at migrant sites across the country.

All reported migrants are Ethiopian nationals.

NOTE: This data does not include Djibouti City. Since the closure of the Massagara site, new migrants arriving from Yemen are hosted in the Migration Response Center (MRC) in Obock.

IMMEDIATE NEEDS: Water, food, hygiene kits, non food items (NFI)

RETURNS FROM YEMEN BETWEEN 1 AND 31 OCTOBER 2020



From 1 to 31 October 2020, 1,019 migrants from Yemen (64 female and 955 male) arrived at Obock coast. Since May 2020, a total of 4,241 migrants (655 female and 3,586 male) returning from Yemen have been recorded mainly between Moulhoule and Ras Bir.
