




A total of 1,464 movements were recorded, comprising 1,142 arrivals and 322 departures, between 30 November and 6 December 2020. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Damboa, Dikwa, Gwoza, Hawul, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most-affected Nigerian State of Borno. Arrivals were also recorded in Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of the state of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Hawul and Kala/Balge LGA of Borno; Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Numan and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (61.6%), poor living conditions (24.7%), improved security (9.2%), and conflict/Attack (4.5%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Ngala: 202 arrivals were recorded in Ngala LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 98 from Marwa region of Cameroon, 77 from Kala/Balge LGA of Borno state and 27 from Bul region of Chad Republic. All of the movements recorded were as a result of voluntary relocation.

Gwoza: 131 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. The arrivals included 58 from Marwa region in Cameroon, 37 from Yola South LGA of Adamawa state, 29 from Gwoza and 7 from Bama LGAs of Borno state. 50 per cent of the movements recorded were triggered by poor living conditions and the other 50 per cent relocated as a result of Conflict/Attack.

Gombi: 39 arrivals and 68 departures were recorded in Gombi LGA of Adamawa state. The arrivals included 22 from Yola North and 17 from Fufore LGAs of Adamawa state. The departures included 26 from Gombi, 22 from Michika and 20 from Hong LGAs of Adamawa state. All movements recorded were due to voluntary relocation.

Damboa: 98 arrivals were recorded in Damboa LGA of Borno state. All arrivals were from Azur/Multe/Forfor ward in Damboa LGA of Borno state. All of the movements recorded were triggered by poor living conditions.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Sector partners for 116 children of 6-59 months. Of the 116 children screened, the MUAC reading was 2 children (from Accessible areas) in the Red category, 6 were in the Yellow category and 108 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 5 LGAs that we received reports from.

The results also include 61 children from neighboring countries (1 in Bama, 9 in Gwoza, 14 in Mobbar and 37 in Ngala). Of all the 61 children measured, 2 children was recorded in the Red category, 56 in the Green category and the remaining 3 in the Yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
