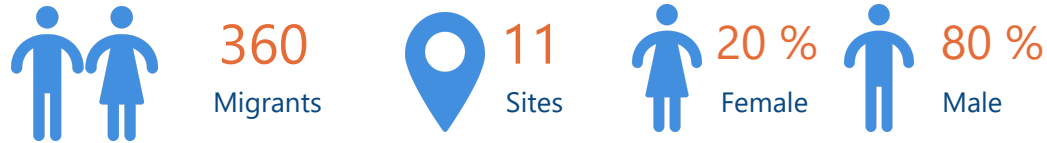


## STRANDED MIGRANTS IN DJIBOUTI AS OF 21 JANUARY 2021



Following the border closure in Ethiopia and due to the stricter border management policies in Yemen, some of the migrants who were transiting through Djibouti on their way to or from the Arabian Peninsula found themselves stranded in the country. These migrants live in spontaneous sites located along the migration corridor.

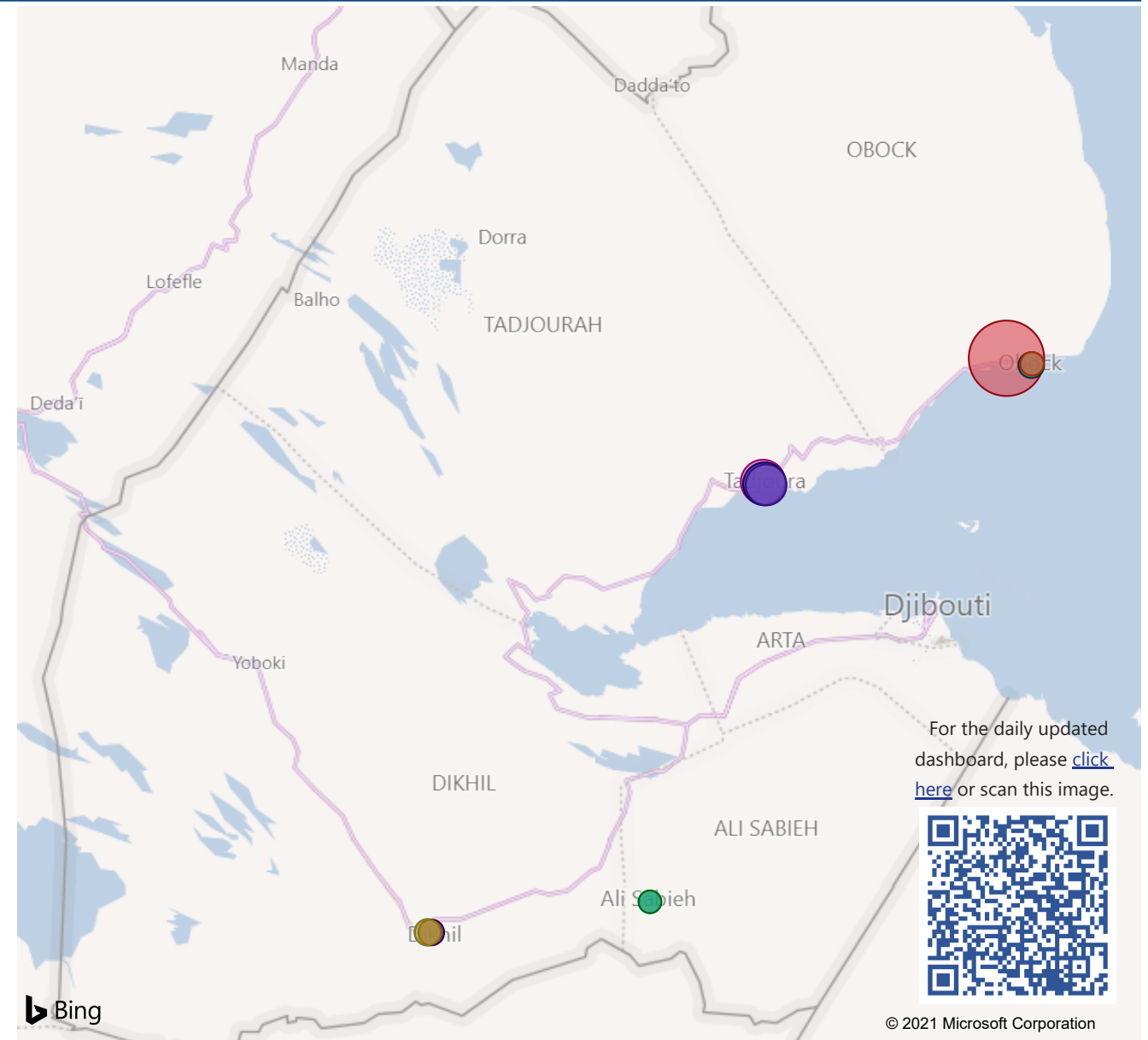
The Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), through its field enumerator teams and key informants, collects data on a daily basis at migrant sites across the country.

All reported migrants are Ethiopian nationals.

*NOTE: This data does not include Djibouti City. Since January 2021, new vulnerable migrants from Yemen and Ethiopia are hosted in the Migration Response Center (MRC) in Obock.*

## RETURNS FROM YEMEN BETWEEN 1 AND 21 JANUARY 2021



From 1 to 21 January 2021, 1,147 migrants from Yemen (33 female and 1,114 male) arrived at Obock coast. Since May 2020, a total of 7,309 migrants (733 female and 6,576 male) returning from Yemen have been recorded mainly between Moulhoulé and Ras Bir.
