
SUMMARY OF EVENT



DISPLACED POPULATION:

790 Internally Displaced Persons, 180 Households (estimates)

- On I March 2021, following an abduction by Non-State Armed Groups which occurred on 24 February 2021 in the Ngouboua sous-préfecture (Kaya département), 65 households (212 individuals) preventively fled the village of Tchou-Ngachia (located on the islands of Lake Chad) for an as of yet unnamed site located on the mainland, in the surroundings of the **Tchoukoutalia** site (in the same sous-préfecture).
- On 8 and 9 March 2021, following an armed attack which occurred in the village of Sidiya on I March 2021, II5 households (578 individuals) preventively fled the villages of Sidiya, Kollom, Selyarom, Koygoua and Guelia located on the islands of Lake Chad (Bol sous-préfecture, Mamdi département) for the site of Maar, located on the mainland (in the same sous-préfecture).
