
OVERVIEW

The lingering conflict in Nigeria's North East Zone has been the major cause of widespread population displacement. Over 2 million persons have been forced to leave their areas of residence in search of safety and security in neighbouring Wards and LGAs.


On 01 and 02 March 2021, a Non-State Armed Group (NSAG) carried out an attack in Dikwa LGA, leading to a substantial wave of population displacement. Following the attack, multiple flow monitoring assessments were conducted by DTM field staff with the purpose of informing the humanitarian community and government partners, and enabling targeted response. Flash reports utilise direct observation and a broad network of key informants to gather representative data and collect information on the number, profile and immediate needs of the affected population.

As a result of the attack, between 2 and 14 April 2021, a total of 3,416 individuals were displaced from Dikwa LGA towards the LGAs Jere and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council. They arrived at Dikwa Motor Park (Dusuman Ward in Jere LGA) from various camps and communities in Dikwa LGA. As presented on the map below, their intended destinations were locations in the LGAs Jere and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council in Borno State.




GENDER (FIG. 1)



MOST NEEDED ASSISTANCE (FIG. 2)




AGE CLASSIFICATION (FIG. 3)

In addition to Care international's monthly food distribution, the local government has supported with distributuion of food items.



Damaged shelters in Fulatari Camp and Agric Camp have been reconstructed by SEMA and UNHCR. There is on-going shelter construction by UNHCR in Alhaji Bashir, Shehuri Mudu Kasa and Ministry of Works Camps for the victims of the attack in Dikwa.



Care International and the National Youth Council of Nigeria (NYCN) distributed NFIs to the targeted vulnerable set of beneficiaries in Mohammed Kyari Camp and Ajari Camp. This has reduced the NFI needs in the locations where they were distributed.



The services provided by the available clinics do not suffice to meet the needs of the IDPs in the camps and the IDPs living among host communities. IDPs rely majorly on chemists for their health related services. There is an urgent need for support.

Furthermore, there is a need for psychosocial support and counseling after the traumatizing attack and the widespread loss of properties.



IOM dislodged toilets in Sangaya, Fulatari, Agric, Klagaru, Kamchiji IDPs Camp and Ministry of Works Camp. COVID-19 sensitization and hygiene promotion were carried out by IOM WASH volunteers in various Camps.

UNHCR repaired some boreholes in Sangaya IDPs Camp, they now have enough suply of water. Meanwhile, the solar boreholes in Ministry of Works have been repaired.
