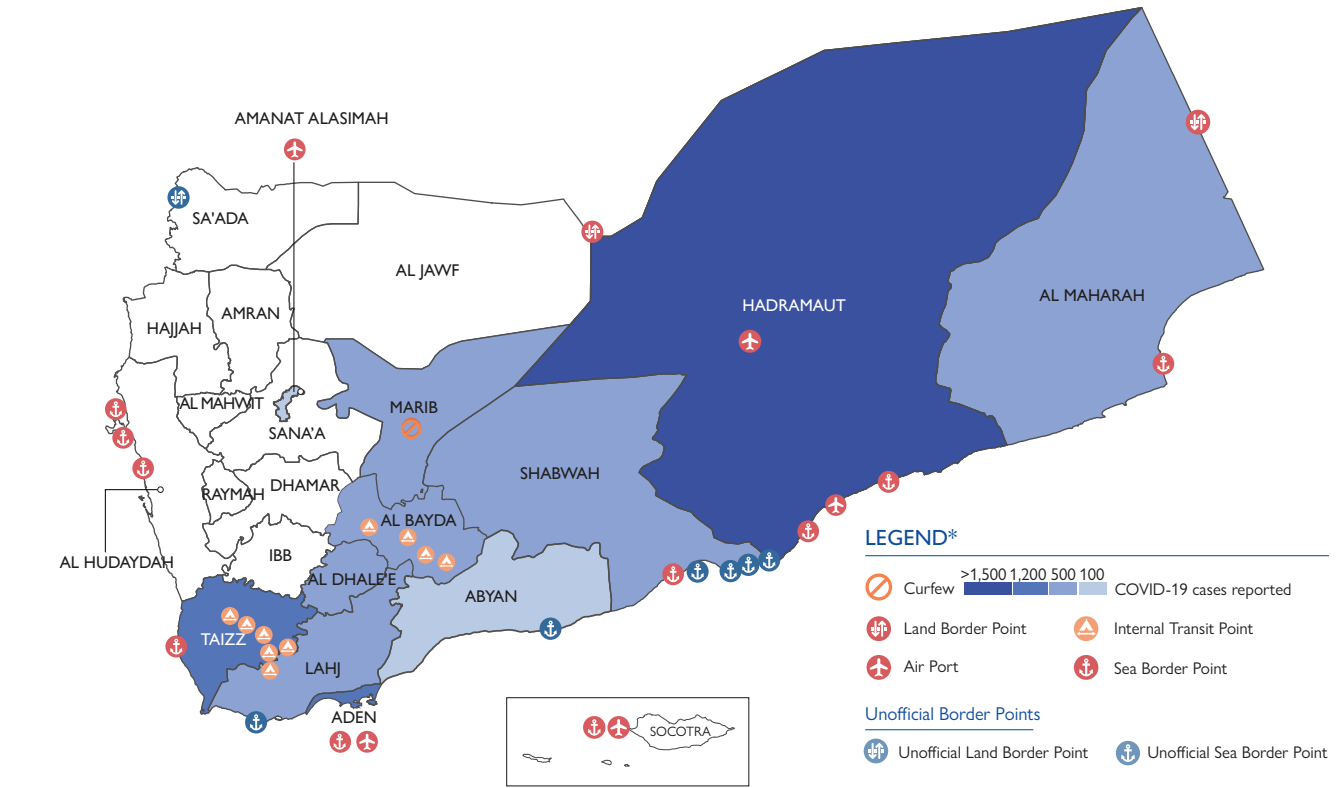

HIGHLIGHTS (From 01 to 30 April 2021)

- 2,047 new cases – 340 new deaths | source: [WHO](#)
- Updates on numbers of new cases in areas controlled by Sana'a DFA are not available.
- 842 Non-Yemeni migrants arrived at the southern governorates of (Shabwah and Lahj).
- 05 IDP Households reported COVID-19 as the reason of displacement. So far, the total number of IDPs who have cited COVID-19 as the primary reason for displacement is 1,559 households ([see RDT Dashboard for more information](#)).
- On 20 April 2021, Yemen launched the first round of its COVID-19 vaccination campaign in Aden and covered 13 Yemeni governorates. The campaign aims to reach 317,363 people in 133 districts across Yemen.
- On 23 April 2021, the Supreme National Emergency Committee for Coronavirus directed to temporarily suspend flights from Yemen to India, until further notice, in light of the sharp increase in the number of COVID-19 cases, as the second wave outbreaks hits India.

Mobility Restrictions

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the local authorities of Yemen declared a nationwide health emergency and introduced many preventative measures similar to those adopted by the rest of the world starting in March 2020, in order to reduce the transmission of the virus. The Yemeni authorities had put additional preventive measures and health screenings for people passing through ten transit points used for public movement between southern and northern governorates, specifically at points located in Taizz and Al-Bayda. These restrictions have been loosened and the health screenings have been removed. For Yemeni returnees from KSA through Al Wadeeah border point and from Oman through Shahin border point providing a COVID-19 PCR test report is mandatory. Fifteen sea border points and three land border points are reopened for movement.



-  The movement restrictions were lifted, and the health screenings have been removed from transit points.
-  Al Wadeeah land border point is open, allowing Yemenis holding a negative PCR test to enter KSA. Al Shahin land border point is partially opened; only permitting entry to Yemen from Oman subject to providing a negative PCR test. Entry to Oman however is prohibited by the Omani authorities, except for humanitarian cases.
-  International Airports in Sana'a, Aden, Sayun and Al Rayan reopened for international flights.
-  Authorities in the governorate of Ma'rib imposed a curfew for the period of Ramadan from 01 a.m. until 11 a.m. in an attempt to combat the spread of COVID-19.
