# **EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)**

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and to collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a s ubcomponent of the Mobility Tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilises direct observation and a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.




Between 17 and 23 May 2021, a total of 2,427 movements were recorded in the states of Adamawa and Borno. The recorded movements consisted of 1,977 arrivals and 450 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza, Hawul, Jere and Kala/Balge Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected state of Borno and in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno, and Demsa, Fufore, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Numan and Song LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: poor living conditions (902 individuals or 37%), voluntary relocation (656 individuals or 27%), improved security (645 individuals or 27%), fear of attack (154 individuals or 6%) and conflict/attack (61 individuals or 3%).

## **SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS**

Askira/Uba: 465 arrivals and 124 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 285 individuals from Chibok LGA in Borno State, 88 individuals from within Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State, 52 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State, 35 individuals from Girei LGA in Adamawa State and 5 individuals from Bauchi LGA in Bauchi State. The departures included 62 individuals to Gombi LGA in Adamawa State, 41 individuals to Gwoza LGA in Borno State and 21 individuals to Maiha LGA in Adamawa State. Sixty-four per cent of the movements recorded were a result of the improved security situation in areas of origin, 25 per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions and 11 per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation.

Song: 245 arrivals and 25 departures were recorded in Song LGA of Adamawa State. All arrivals were from within Song LGA in Adamawa State. All individuals reported that their intended destination was Maiha LGA in Adamawa State. Ninety-one per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions and 9 per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation.

Mubi North: 116 arrivals and 74 departures were recorded in Mubi North LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 65 individuals from Madagali LGA in Adamawa State, 24 individuals from Mubi South LGA in Adamawa State, 19 individuals from within Mubi North LGA in Adamawa State and 8 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State. The departures included 38 individuals to Maiha LGA in Adamawa State, 29 individuals to Hong LGA in Adamawa State and 7 individuals to Yola South LGA in Adamawa State. Forty per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation, 34 per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions and 26 per cent of the movements recorded were due to fear of attacks.

Michika: 149 arrivals and 28 departures were recorded in Michika LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 93 individuals from Song LGA in Adamawa State, 23 individuals from within Michika LGA in Adamawa State, 19 individuals from Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State and 14 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State. All individuals who departed had Gombi LGA in Adamawa State as their destination. Seventy-six per cent of the movements recorded were a result of the improved security situation in areas of origin and 24 per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

#### **NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)**

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 53 children of 6-59 months. Of the 53 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 12 children were recorded in the red category, none in the yellow category and 41 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the 2 LGAs assessed.

The results also included 28 children who arrived from neighbouring countries (13 in Bama and 15 in Gwoza). All the 28 children measured were recorded in the green category, with none in red and yellow categories. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
