



# EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and to collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the Mobility Tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilises direct observation and a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.






Between 31 May and 6 June 2021, a total of 1,962 movements were recorded in the states of Adamawa and Borno. The recorded movements consisted of 1,295 arrivals and 667 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza, Kala/Balge and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected state of Borno and in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Bama and Ngala LGA of Borno, and Demsa, Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (1,210 individuals or 62%), poor living conditions (472 individuals or 24%) and improved security (277 individuals or 14%).

### SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

**Hong:** 188 arrivals and 42 departures were recorded in Hong LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 73 individuals from Gwoza LGA in Borno State, 62 individuals from Hawul LGA in Borno State, 29 individuals from Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State and 24 individuals from Michika LGA in Adamawa State. All individuals who departed had Hong LGA in Adamawa State as their destination. Ninety per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation and 10 per cent of the movements recorded were due to improved security situation in areas of origin.

**Askira/Uba:** 93 arrivals and 115 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 50 individuals from Katagum LGA in Bauchi State, 34 individuals from within Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State, 5 individuals from Jalingo LGA in Taraba State and 4 individuals from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGA in Borno State. The departures included 41 individuals to Chibok LGA in Borno State, 29 individuals to Gwoza LGA in Borno State, 29 individuals to Gombi LGA in Adamawa State and 16 individuals to Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State. Forty-eight per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions, 48 per cent of the movements recorded were a result of the improved security situation in areas of origin, and 4 per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation.

**Mubi North:** 94 arrivals and 62 departures were recorded in Mubi North LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 65 individuals from Madagali LGA in Adamawa State, 16 individuals from within Mubi North LGA in Adamawa State and 13 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State. The departures included 44 individuals to Maiha LGA in Adamawa State and 18 individuals to Mubi North LGA in Adamawa State. Fifty-two per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions and 48 per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation.

**Michika:** 127 arrivals and 24 departures were recorded in Michika LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 48 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State, 43 individuals from Michika LGA in Adamawa State and 36 individuals from Gombi LGA in Adamawa State. All individuals reported that their intended destination was Gombi LGA in Adamawa State. Thirty-five per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions, 34 per cent of the movements recorded were a result of the improved security situation in areas of origin and 31 per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation.

## NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 37 children of 6-59 months. Of the 37 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 2 children were recorded in the red category, 5 children in the yellow category and 36 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the 3 LGAs assessed.

The results also included 26 children who arrived from neighbouring countries (15 in Bama, 5 in Gwoza and 6 in Ngala). Of all the 26 children measured, none was recorded in the red category, 4 in the green category and the remaining 22 in the yellow category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
