

## EMERGENCY EVENT TRACKING

Data collection: 9 June 2021

CONFLICT



The DTM Emergency Event Tracking (EET) is deployed to track sudden displacement and population movements, provide more frequent updates on the scale of displacement, and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the new Mobility Tracking methodology in Sudan (Round One), and activated on a need basis, EET utilises a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population presence per location – a useful tool for humanitarian response planning and design.

## Event Overview

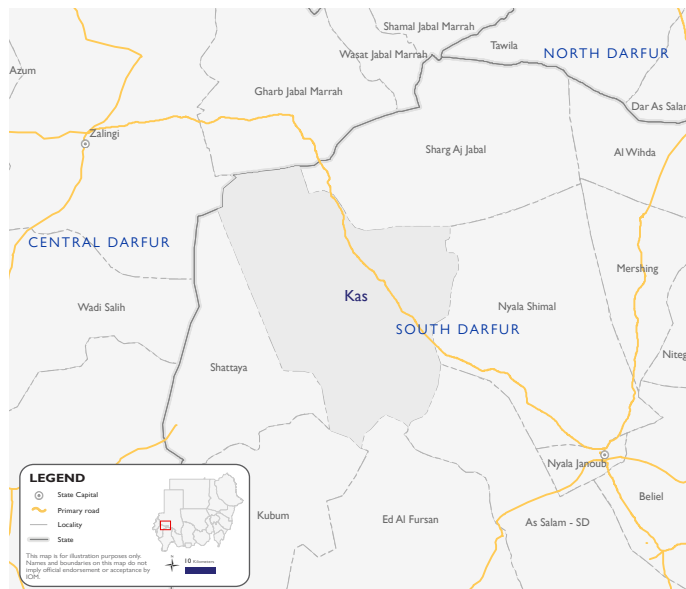

DTM teams activated EET to monitor the displacement of individuals affected by violent clashes that erupted between an SLA/AW faction and the Bani Hussein tribe on 5 June 2021 in the goldmining area of Dangja village, Kas, South Darfur. The first EET update estimates a total number of 150 individuals (30 households) seeking shelter in open areas of Dangja village. All displaced individuals are Sudanese nationals. Field reports indicate 14 individuals were killed. At least 37 displaced individuals are reported to have additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support, and 15 individuals report lost goods, cattle or livestock. Based on a ranking scale, the three priority needs across the caseload are emergency shelter, food and non-food items.

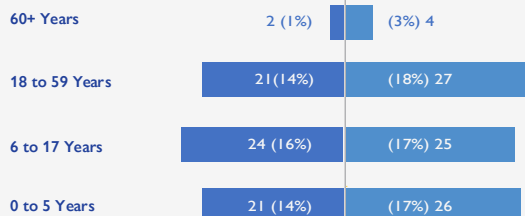
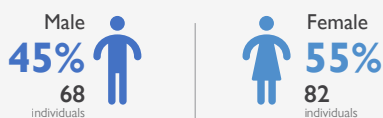
