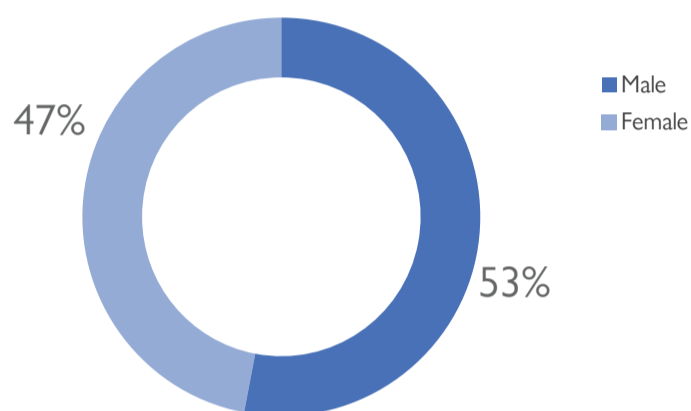

OVERVIEW
The lingering conflict in Nigeria's North East Zone has been the major cause of widespread population displacement. Over 2 million persons have been forced to leave their areas of residence in search of safety and security in neighbouring wards and LGAs.

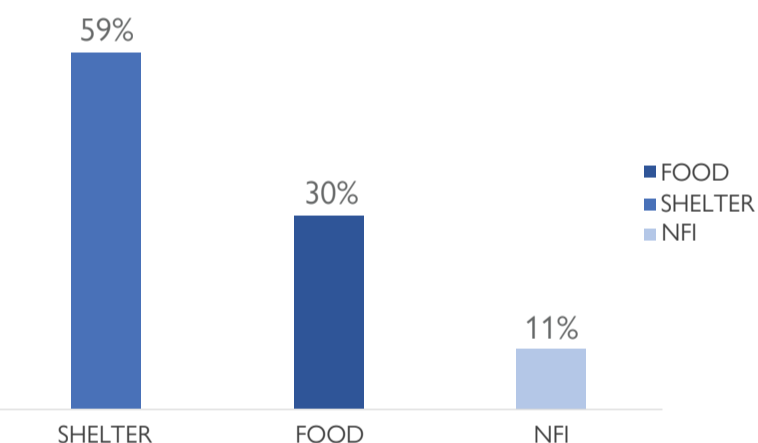
Since the beginning of March, repeated attacks by Non-State Armed Groups (NSAG) have been reported in Dikwa LGA. On 8 June 2021, Dikwa LGA was attacked once more by a Non-State Armed Group, leading to a new wave of population displacement. Following these attacks, numerous displacements have occurred and continue to occur until today. Flow monitoring assessments have been conducted by IOM DTM field staff with the purpose of informing the humanitarian community and government partners about forced population movements, and enabling targeted response. DTM enumerators were deployed in the transit point Dikwa Motor Park in the ward Dusuman in Jere LGA. IDPs passing through the transit point were asked about their intended destinations and most needed assistance. Since the beginning of May, it was noted that numerous households have started to return to their locations of origin. These return movements were also captured at Dikwa Motor Park in the ward Dusuman and are presented on the map and graphic below.

As a result of the attack on 8 June 2021, a total of 1,642 individuals were displaced from Dikwa LGA towards the LGAs Jere and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council, 1 individual died and 3 individuals were injured. They arrived at Dikwa Motor Park from various camps and communities in Dikwa LGA. As presented on the map below, their intended destinations were locations in the LGAs Jere, Konduga and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council in Borno State. Since the first attack in Dikwa on 1 March 2021, a total of 20,286 IDPs have been recorded by DTM in Dikwa Motor Park. They were displaced from Dikwa LGA and en route to destinations in the LGAs Jere and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council in Borno State. Additionally, since 1 May 2021, a total of 7,238 returnees have been recorded by DTM in the same transit point. They are returning from locations in the LGA Maiduguri Metropolitan Council towards Dikwa LGA.

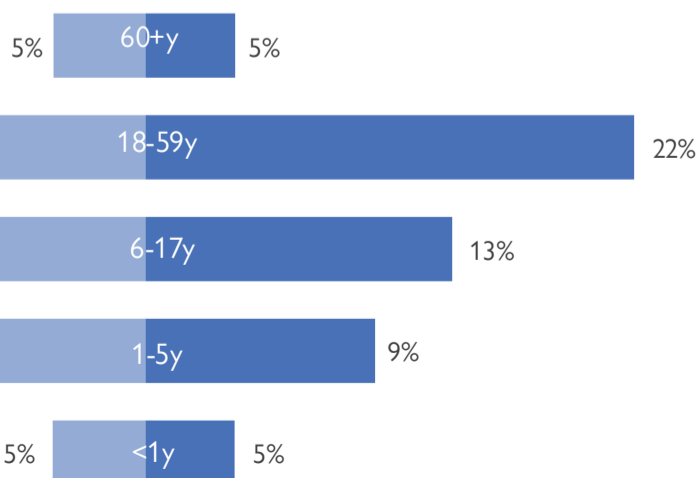
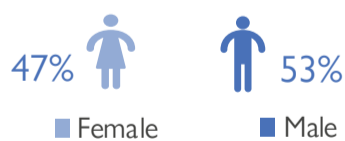
GENDER OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 5 AND 11 JUNE (FIG. 1)



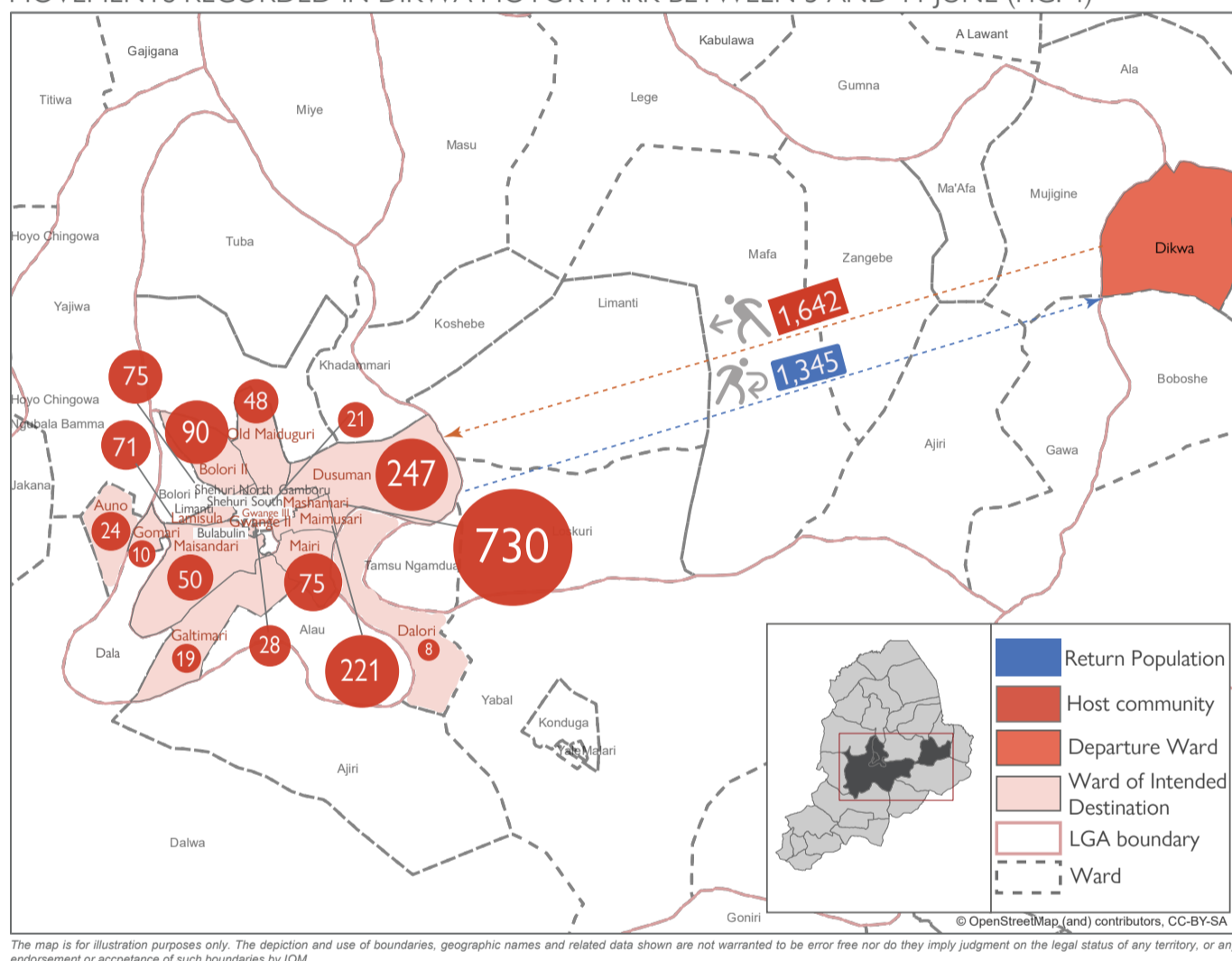
IDPs MOST NEEDED ASSISTANCE OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 5 AND 11 JUNE (FIG. 2)



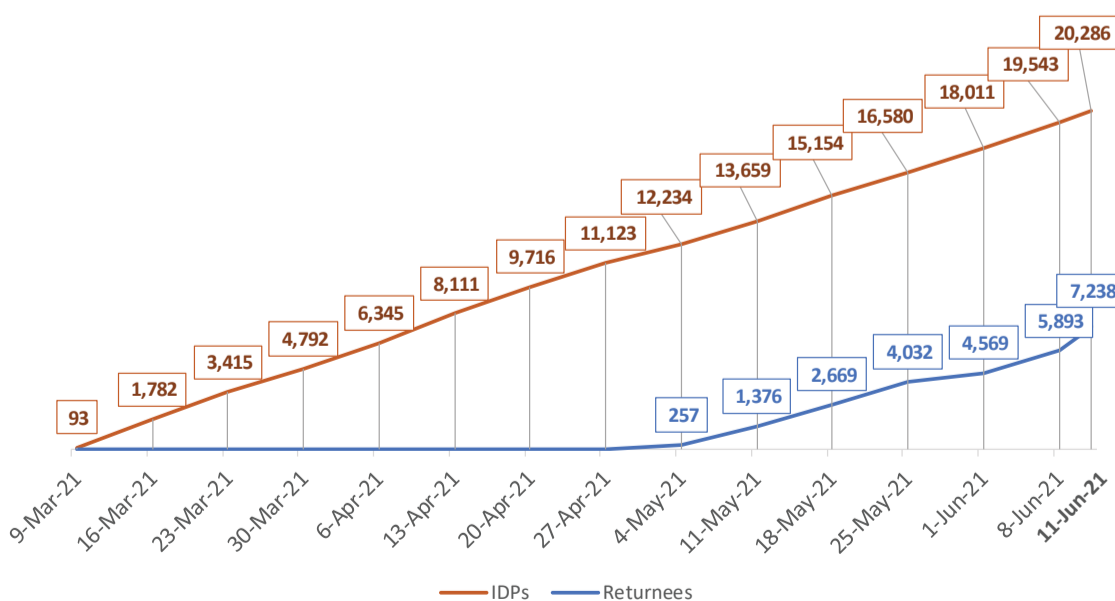
AGE CLASSIFICATION OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 5 AND 11 JUNE (FIG. 3)

SECTORIAL INFORMATION ON LOCATION OF ORIGIN - DIKWA



FOOD

In the past week, Care International started to replace former SCOPE cards issued by CAID. Care International is ensuring that issues concerning SCOPE cards will be resolved and CAID SCOPE cards are replaced to further enforce the “no SCOPE card, no food distribution” policy. In the past week, ICRC also organized a food distribution.



NFI

FAO distributed fuel efficiency stoves (locally made charcoal stoves) across camps in the past week.



SHELTER

There was a fire incident at 1000 Camp in the past week that affected 1 household of 5 individuals. Their shelter was partially damaged and a woman sustained a fire injury. She was given medical support at the ICRC clinic in the camp. It has been observed that most shelters are completely destroyed by windstorms, rainfall and fire outbreaks while others are damaged because of termites and worn-out tarpaulins.

There is still need for shelter support as shelter issues continue to persist across all camps in Dikwa LGA. However, NRC has started supporting in Fulatari Camp but their support was put on hold as a result of the frequent attacks.

Additionally, 32 shelters in Shehu Masta II Camp were burned down by the military, the shelters belonged to 32 households and 254 individuals.



HEALTH

The Dikwa General Hospital has now resumed its operations and has started to support IDPs in the past weeks. However, the facilities and medication in the hospital do not suffice to meet the needs of the IDPs and host community.



WASH

IOM WASH volunteers continued COVID-19 sensitization and hygiene promotion campaigns in various camps. In the past week, the hygiene promotion included a cholera prevention campaign in case an outbreak should occur. On a weekly basis, the environmental and sanitation situation is assessed by the IOM WASH volunteers.



LIVELIHOOD

In the past week, ICRC distributed improved seeds alongside farm tools for farming during the rainy season.



SAFETY AND SECURITY

There was an attack by a NSAG in the past week, which led to the death of 1 individual and three individuals were injured. Two of the injured individuals were taken to Dikwa General Hospital for treatment.
