TOTAL NUMBER OF IDPS CURRENTLY DISPLACED








On 21 January:

- Approximately 3 families arrived to Haj Ali camp, while 10 families left;
- Qayyarah Airstrip emergency site received approximately 3 families, while 8 families left;
- Qayyarah Jad'ah 2 camp received 1 family, while 5 families left;
- Approximately 12 families reached Qayyarah Jad'ah 3 camp, while 22 families left;
- Qayyarah Jad'ah camp reported the arrival of 1 family;
- Nargizlia 1 Camp received 7 families from from Merkaz Mosul sub-district.

*Emergency tracking numbers are not cumulative. They reflect a snapshot of displacement on the day of reporting. The number of individuals is calculated by multiplying the number of identified families by six, which is the average size of an Iragi family.
