

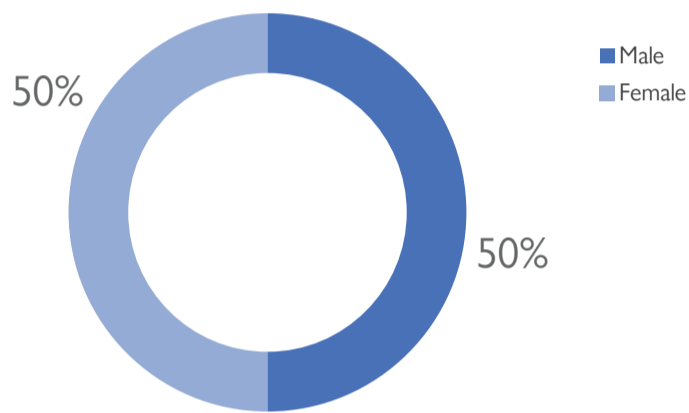


OVERVIEW
The lingering conflict in Nigeria's North East Zone has been the major cause of widespread population displacement. Over 2 million persons have been forced to leave their areas of residence in search of safety and security in neighbouring wards and LGAs.

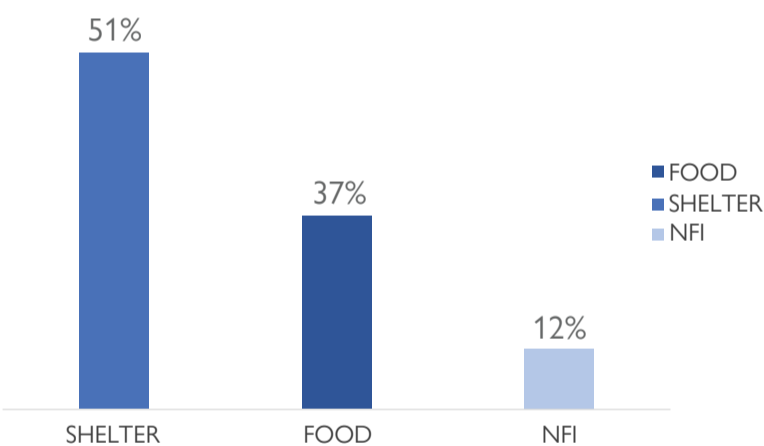
Since the beginning of March, repeated attacks by Non-State Armed Groups (NSAG) have been reported in Dikwa LGA. Following these attacks, numerous displacements have occurred and continue to occur until today. On 24 June 2021, Dikwa LGA was attacked once more by a Non-State Armed Group, leading to a new wave of population displacement. Flow monitoring assessments have been conducted by IOM DTM field staff with the purpose of informing the humanitarian community and government partners about forced population movements, and enabling targeted response. DTM enumerators were deployed in the transit point Dikwa Motor Park in the ward Dusuman in Jere LGA. IDPs passing through the transit point were asked about their intended destinations and most needed assistance. Since the beginning of May, it was noted that numerous households have started to return to their locations of origin. These return movements were also captured at Dikwa Motor Park in the ward Dusuman and are presented on the map and graphic below.

As a result of the attack on 24 June 2021, a total of 1,344 individuals were displaced from Dikwa LGA towards the LGAs Jere and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council and 3 individuals were injured. They arrived at Dikwa Motor Park from various camps and communities in Dikwa LGA. As presented on the map below, their intended destinations were locations in the LGAs Jere and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council in Borno State. Since the first attack in Dikwa on 1 March 2021, a total of 22,824 IDPs have been recorded by DTM in Dikwa Motor Park. They were displaced from Dikwa LGA and en route to destinations in the LGAs Jere and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council in Borno State. Additionally, since 1 May 2021, a total of 9,636 returnees have been recorded by DTM in the same transit point. They are returning from locations in the LGA Maiduguri Metropolitan Council towards Dikwa LGA.

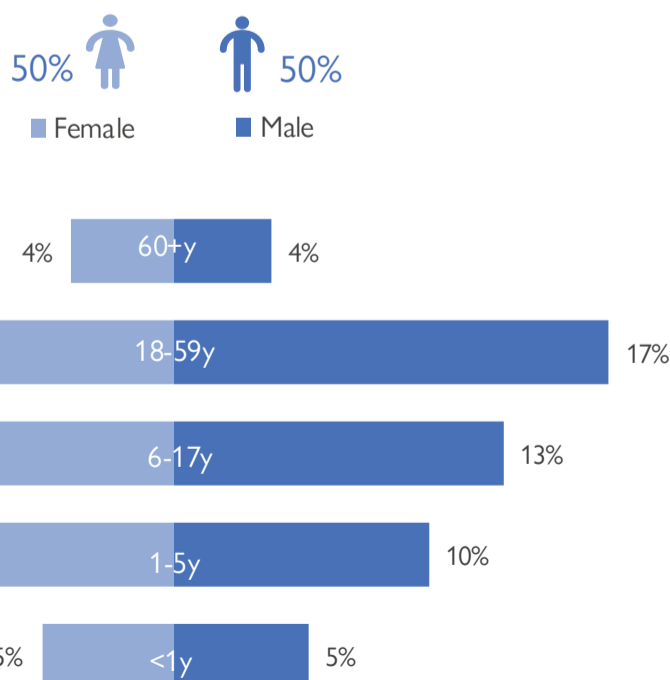
GENDER OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 19 AND 25 JUNE (FIG. 1)



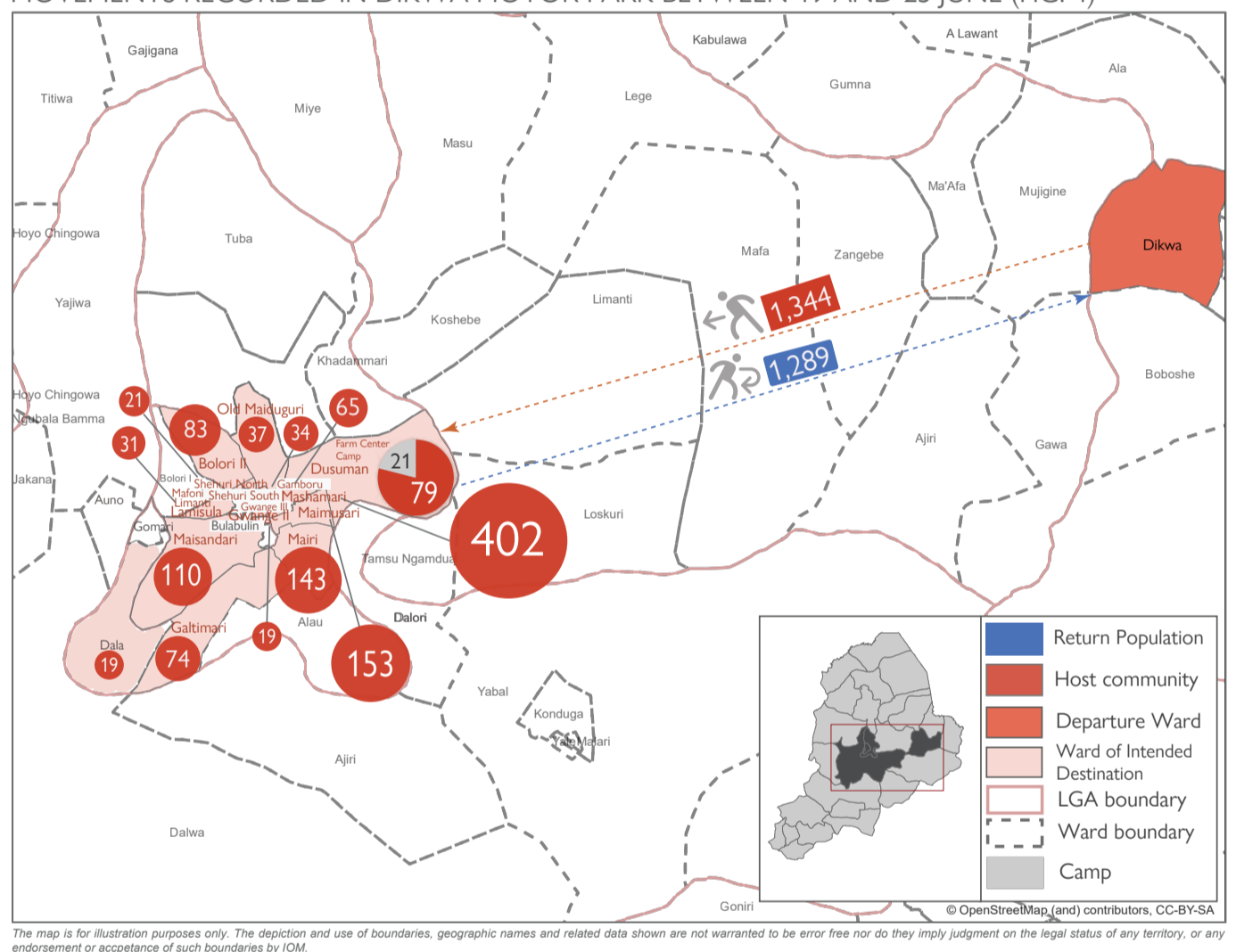
IDPs MOST NEEDED ASSISTANCE OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 19 AND 25 JUNE (FIG. 2)



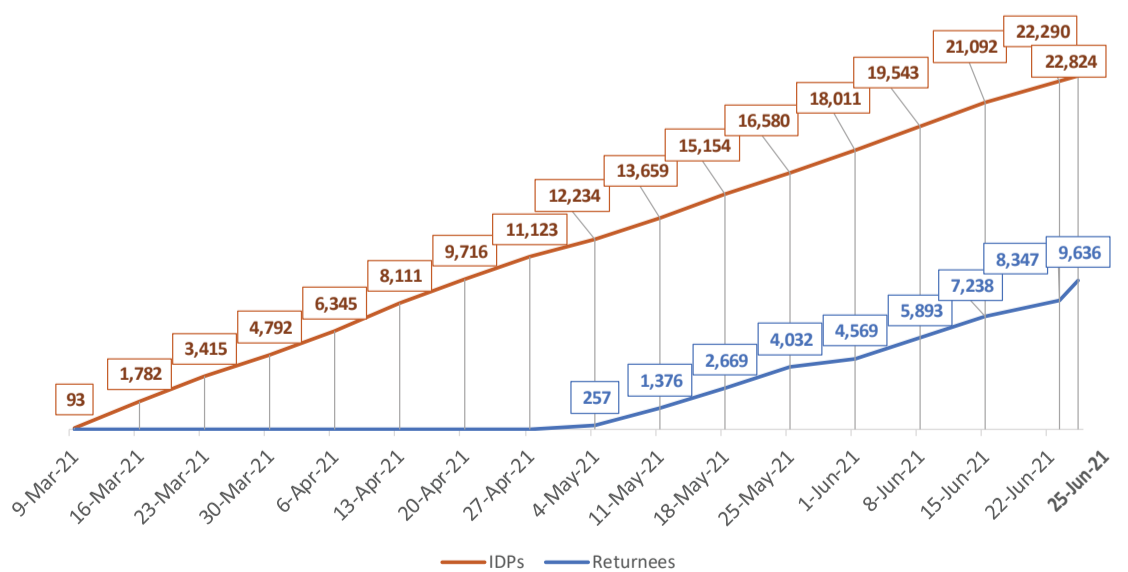
AGE CLASSIFICATION OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 19 AND 25 JUNE (FIG. 3)

SECTORIAL INFORMATION ON LOCATION OF ORIGIN - DIKWA



FOOD

Concerns were raised in the past week by some households who did not benefit from the monthly food distribution. However, the IDPs were made to understand that they were not captured in the SCOPE card registration/update that was carried out in the previous month. Care International has assured that these issues will be looked into in the coming days.



SHELTER

NRC has completed the shelter construction in Fulatari (150 shelters) and Masarmari (15 shelters) Camps in the past week. It has been observed that most of the old shelters are completely destroyed by windstorms, rainfall and fire outbreaks while others are partially damaged because of termites and worn-out tarpaulins. There is still need for shelter support as shelter issues continue to persist across most camps in Dikwa LGA.



HEALTH

There are two functioning health facilities in Dikwa, the General Hospital and the clinic, both are operated by the government. However, the facilities and medication do not suffice to meet the needs of the IDPs and host community. WHO started immunization campaign in the past week.



WASH

IOM WASH volunteers continued COVID-19 sensitization and hygiene promotion campaigns in various camps. In the past week, the hygiene promotion included a cholera prevention campaign in case an outbreak should occur. On a weekly basis, the environmental and sanitation situation is assessed by the IOM WASH volunteers.



SAFETY AND SECURITY

There was an attack in Dikwa by a NSAG in the past week, as a result, three individuals were injured. One of the injured individuals was taken to a hospital in Maiduguri for medical support.
