



## Population profile


### Juba IDP Camp 1 | Juba IDP Camp 3



### Household size




Percentage calculated based on the overall population for each Site



The International Organization for Migration (IOM) Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) team in South Sudan maintains biometric registration database in both Juba IDP Camp 1 and Juba IDP Camp 3. During maintenance IOM carries out registration of new born babies, replacement of lost cards, merging of households that have requested to be included under one household and handling of referred protection cases from protection partners. In December 2020 the population of IDPs in the two Sites comprised a total of 30,824 individuals (9,273 households).


About 57 per cent of the registered population were found to be youths under the age of 18 years, while 49 per cent were female. IDP Camp 3 is more populated than IDP Camp 1 accounting for 77 per cent of the population.

## Number of individuals per County of habitual residence



Most of the registered individuals in Juba IDP Camp 1 and Juba IDP Camp 3 arrived from locations within Juba followed by those who arrived from Leer County. A minority arrived from other locations in South Sudan. The adjacent map represents the habitual residence for 21,614 out of 30,824 registered individuals.

Juba IDP Camp 1: population density by block




**Population density**

Population density varies significantly from block to block. In Juba IDP Camp 1, the highest density was recorded for Blocks B, Q and O with 9 to 10 square meters per person. For Juba IDP Camp 3, the most densely populated block is F, with 19 to 20 square meters per person.

Population density can change over time, as there may be different rates of departure from and arrival to different blocks. Camp management introduced an address system prior to the BMR to facilitate better tracking and re-assignment of empty shelters.
