

The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) - Movement Alert is to collect information on large and sudden population movements, and to provide support to the Government and the humanitarian community by disseminating data on IDPs for informing effective humanitarian response to the affected population. Information is collected through key informant interviews or direct observation. The dashboard provides basic information on displacements recorded in Montepuez district in 05 July. This ETT Movement Alert forms part of a larger exercise in mapping displacement trends on a weekly basis. Reported findings complement information obtained through other DTM data collection activities in the country. Additional information is available upon request.


SUMMARY OF THE EVENT

Following the recent attacks in Palma Sede, DTM teams in Ancuabe, Namuno, Balama, Chiure, Ibo, Mueda, Montepuez, Nangade, Metuge, Mecufi, and Cidade de Pemba continue to observe movements amongst displaced populations. In the district of Montepuez, a significant rise in IDP arrivals has been recorded in 5 July 2021. An estimated 1,501 individuals have arrived to Ntele relocation site, with children constituting a majority (54%) of the movement. In addition, 52 elderly persons were recorded during the assessments.


