

The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements. Information is collected through key informant interviews or direct observation. **This dashboard provides information on displacement which occurred from 3 June to 2 July 2021 in the *département* of Grande Sido (Province of Moyen-Chari)**

On 03, 25, 30 June and 02 July 2021, due to growing insecurity in the north of the Central African Republic (CAR), **1,144 households of 5,042 individuals**, all of Chadian nationals, crossed the border from the Central African city of Kabo, to take refuge in six villages (see page 2 for more details) located in the *sous-préfectures* of Djeké-Djeké, Maro and Sido (*Département* of Grande Sido, Province of Moyen-Chari). This number adds to the 6,457 people that IOM had identified during the month of May 2021 in the province of Moyen-Chari (see [report #3 on returnees from CAR](#)) and to the 709 people in the province of Mandoul (see [report #1 on returnees in the province of Mandoul](#)). As of the publication date, these forced displacement movements were continuing. IOM teams are collecting more in-depth information.

It should be noted that a large number of these returnees were practicing herding in the Central African Republic and arrived with their cattle in their host locations, which are agricultural areas. Local authorities expressed their fear on the risk that this massive arrival of cattle could lead to agro-pastoral conflicts because in search of pastures, these cattle could invade farms. These authorities expressed a need for support in order to manage this situation to prevent any conflict.





Number of Returnees
