The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements. Information is collected through key informant interviews or direct observation. This dashboard provides information on displacement which occurred on 21 June 2021 in a village in the Lac Province.

SUMMARY OF EVENT



DISPLACED POPULATION :

102 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), 25 Households (estimated)

On **21 July 2021**, following an outbreak of violence over a land dispute involving two communities, **25 households (102 individuals)** fled the villages of Layrom and Tchougoudi located in the *sous-préfecture* of Bol (*Département* of Mamdi) to take refuge in the **Yakoua** site, located in the same *sous-préfecture*. In June 2021 the same type of conflict took place in the same area forced 461 individuals to be displaced ([see Emergency Tracking Tool report #108](#)).


