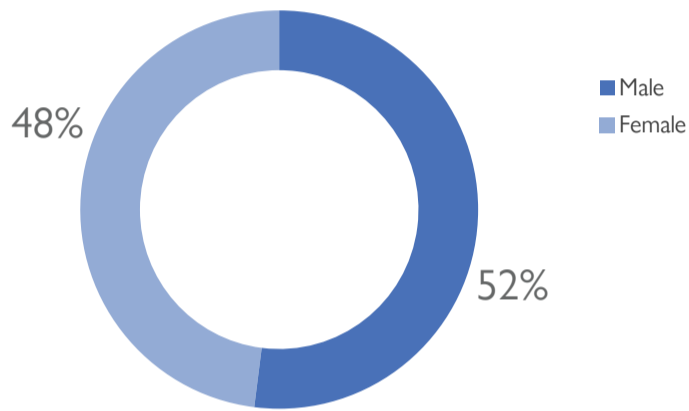
**OVERVIEW**

The lingering conflict in Nigeria's North East Zone has been the major cause of widespread population displacement. Over 2 million persons have been forced to leave their areas of residence in search of safety and security in neighbouring wards and LGAs.

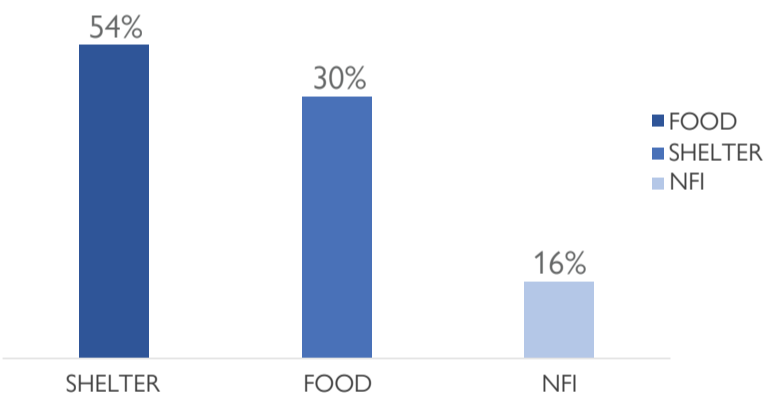
Since the beginning of March, repeated attacks by Non-State Armed Groups (NSAG) have been reported in Dikwa LGA. Following these attacks, numerous displacements have occurred and continue to occur until today. Flow monitoring assessments have been conducted by IOM DTM field staff with the purpose of informing the humanitarian community and government partners about forced population movements, and enabling targeted response. DTM enumerators were deployed in the transit point Dikwa Motor Park in the ward Dusuman in Jere LGA. IDPs passing through the transit point were asked about their intended destinations and most needed assistance. Since the beginning of May, it was noted that numerous households have started to return to their locations of origin. These return movements were also captured at Dikwa Motor Park in the ward Dusuman and are presented on the map and graphic below.

As a result of the attacks between 24 and 30 July 2021, a total of 1,259 individuals were displaced from Dikwa LGA towards the LGAs Jere, Konduga and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council. They arrived at Dikwa Motor Park from various camps and communities in Dikwa LGA. As presented on the map below, their intended destinations were locations in the LGAs Jere, Konduga and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council in Borno State. Since the first attack in Dikwa on 1 March 2021, a total of 29,143 IDPs have been recorded by DTM in Dikwa Motor Park. They were displaced from Dikwa LGA and en route to destinations in the LGAs Jere, Konduga and Maiduguri Metropolitan Council in Borno State. Additionally, since 1 May 2021, a total of 15,769 returnees have been recorded by DTM in the same transit point. They are returning from locations in the LGA Maiduguri Metropolitan Council towards Dikwa LGA.

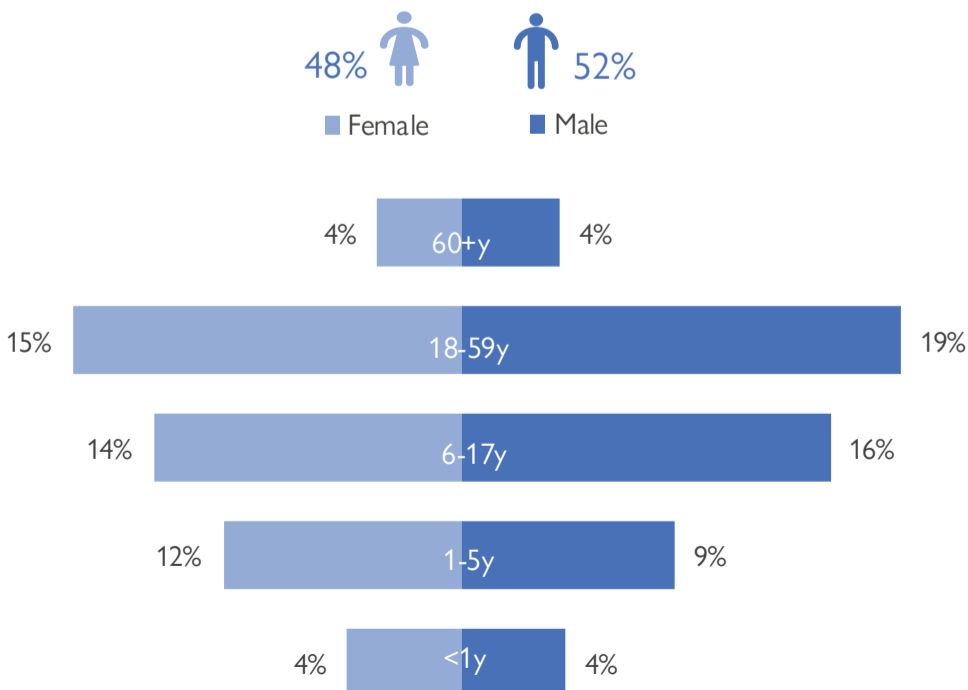
**GENDER OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 24 AND 30 JULY (FIG. 1)**



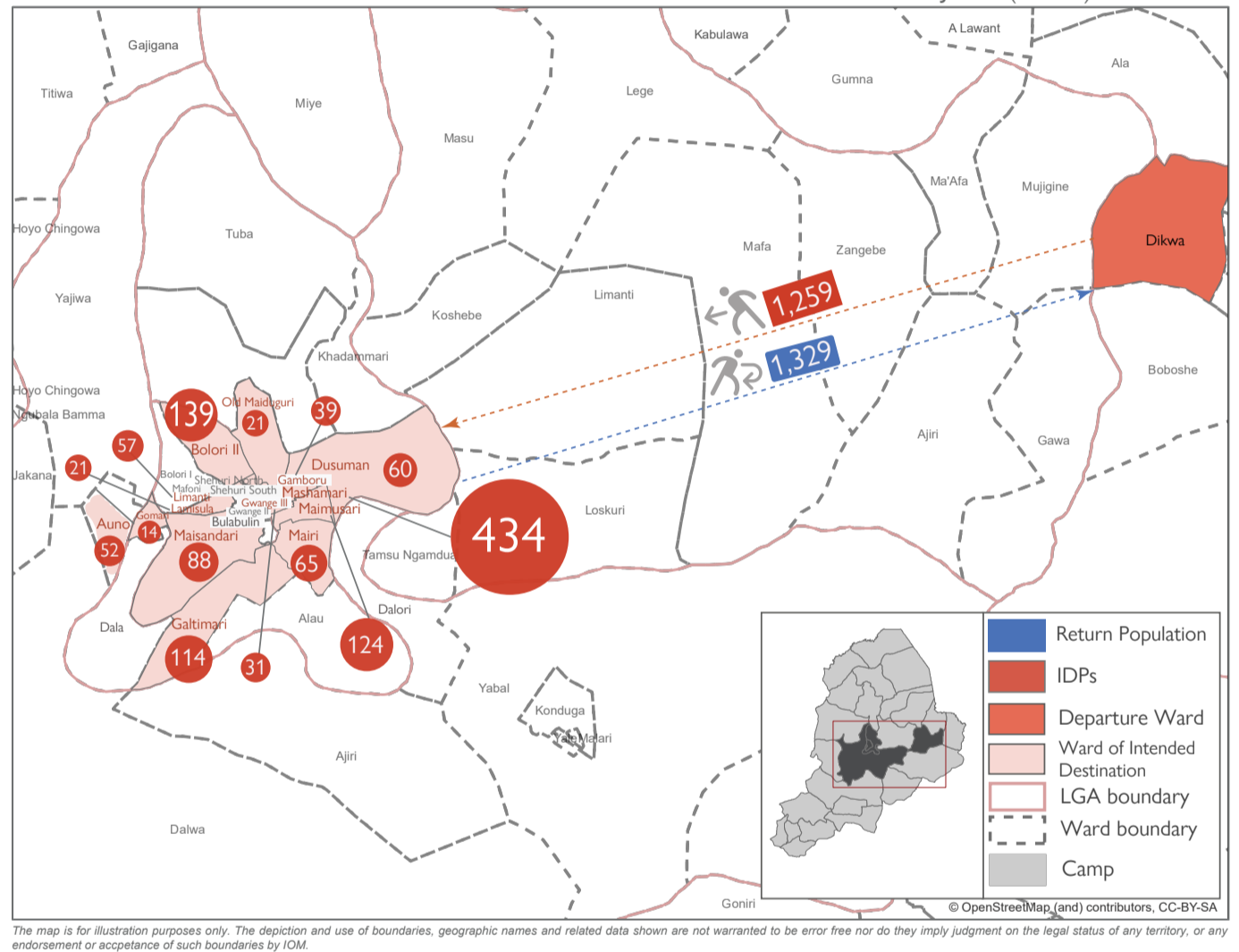
**IDPs MOST NEEDED ASSISTANCE OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 24 AND 30 JULY (FIG. 2)**



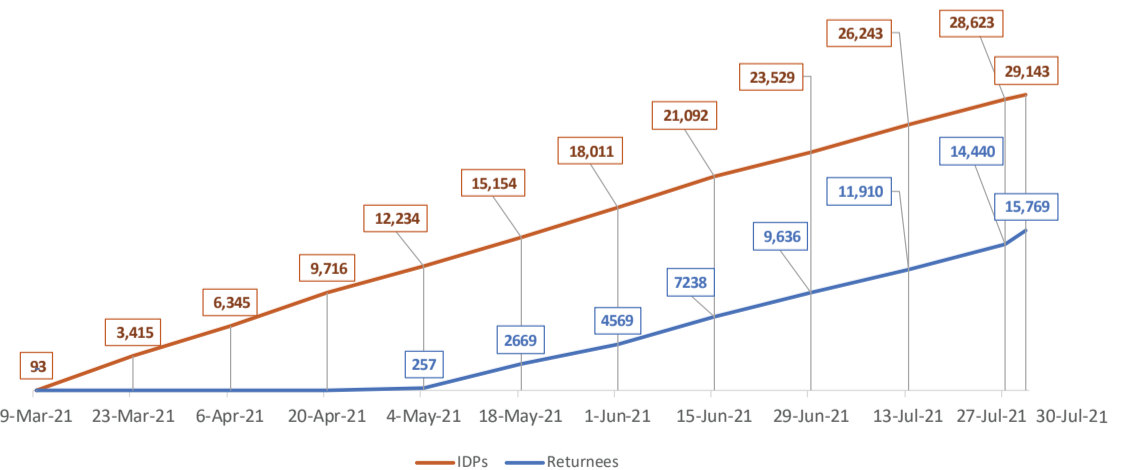
**AGE CLASSIFICATION OF IDPs RECORDED BETWEEN 24 AND 30 JULY (FIG. 3)**

## SECTORIAL INFORMATION ON LOCATION OF ORIGIN - DIKWA



FAO distributed a lump sum of money to the newly selected beneficiaries to overcome the most urgent livelihood needs in the past week.

LIVELIHOOD



NFI

During the past week, DRC distributed full NFI kits and mattresses to IDPs in Bulabulin Camp, 1000 Shelters Camp, Motor Park Camp, Mohammed Kyari Camp, Shuwari Camp, Kamcheji Camp, Ministry of Works Camp, Shehuri Mudu Kasa Camp, Ajari Camp and Alhaji Bashir Camp.



HEALTH

There are two functioning health facilities in Dikwa, the General Hospital and the clinic, both are operated by the government. However, the facilities and medication do not suffice to meet the needs of the IDPs and host community.



WASH

Solidarites International have resumed water trucking to Shuwari Host community and Ministry of Works Camp. In the past week, 2 SI solar boreholes in Fulatari Camp were repaired. Also, the rehabilitation of toilets and showers is on-going in Fulatari Camp. Klagaru and Sangaya Camps have 41 toilets and 63 toilets respectively that need dislodgement. NRC distributed hygiene kits to 450 IDP households. The hygiene kits included: 2 buckets, 2 jerry cans, 2 sachets of detergent, 18 tablets of soap, 2 packs of Oral Rehydraton Treatment (ORT), 2 kettles and 20 sachets of aqua tabs. IOM WASH volunteers continued COVID-19 sensitization and hygiene promotion campaigns in various camps. In the past week, the hygiene promotion included a cholera prevention campaign in case an outbreak should occur. On a weekly basis, the environmental and sanitation situation is assessed by the IOM WASH volunteers.

There were no security issues reported in the past week.
