
DISPLACEMENT SITUATION REPORT

GAROWE DISTRICT (NUGAAL REGION)





Districts in Nugaal, have experienced protracted civil conflict with loss of livelihoods and widespread displacement as well as below average rains since Gu 2015. In November 2015, cyclones Chapala and Megh caused significant damage and affected more than 70,000 people (FAO-SWALIM, 2016). Although Garowe district recorded normal rains in the month of May, most parts of the country remain under drought conditions with the impacts being widespread. More rains are required to end the ongoing drought in the country and the drought situation is expected to continue until the coming Deyr season in October 2017. Displacement is in Nugaal is centred in the main towns of Garowe and Burtinle. A majority of the IDPs originate from southern and central Somalia mostly displaced due to drought. These IDPs are often at risk of fire outbreaks and flooding, especially those living along the river bank of Garowe.





AGE OF THE SETTLEMENTS




IDP SETTLEMENT BY TYPE
