



The DTM Emergency Event Tracking (EET) is deployed to track sudden displacement and population movements, provide more frequent updates on the scale of displacement, and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the new Mobility Tracking methodology in Sudan ([Round Two](#)), and activated on a need basis, EET utilises a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population presence per location – a useful tool for humanitarian response planning and design.

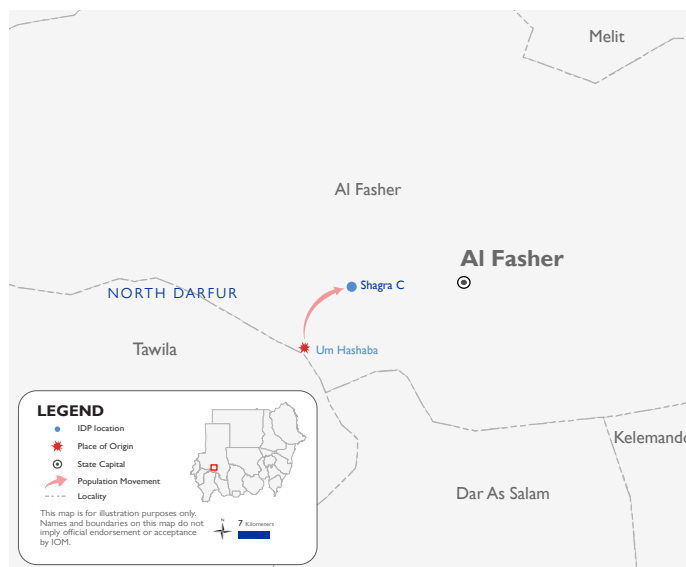

DTM teams activated EET to monitor the displacement of individuals affected by conflict in Al Fasher locality, North Darfur state. On 25 September 2021, Um Hashaba village in Al Fasher locality, North Darfur was attacked by an unknown armed group. The first EET update estimates a total number of 712 individuals (183 households) currently seeking shelter in Shagra C in Al Fasher locality, North Darfur state. The IDP caseload was originally displaced from Um Hashaba village in Al Fasher, North Darfur.

Field teams indicate that there are no reported deaths and four individuals are reported to be injured. Field teams also indicate that 15 individuals report lost goods, cattle, and/or livestock. All affected individuals are Sudanese nationals. DTM teams identified at least 143 cases of additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support. Based on a ranking scale, the three priority needs across the caseload are Food, Health (Medical Needs), and Nutrition.

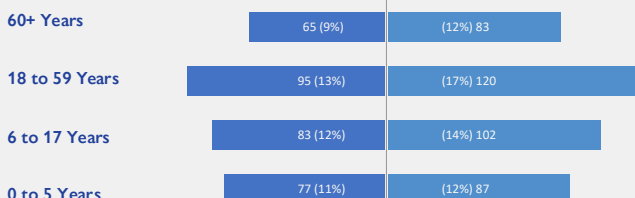
