


DISPLACEMENT TRACKING MATRIX NIGERIA - NORTH EAST ZONE

RETURNEE POPULATION DASHBOARD

OCTOBER 2021 **ROUND 38**

This dashboard presents the key figures on the returnee population tracked during Round 38 of DTM assessments in Nigeria's North East Geopolitical Zone. Between 21 June and 27 July, an estimated 1,918,063 returnees were identified - divided in 309.732 households - across 675 return locations in the states of Borno, Adamawa and Yobe. The Round 38 figure presents an increase of 164,579 returnees or 9 per cent compared to Round 37 when 1,753,484 returnees were identified. This dashboard highlights the number of returnees per state, the demographic composition of the returnee population in North East Nigeria, states of displacement and reasons for initial displacement of returnees. Additionally, this dashboard presents an overview of the LGA's that witnessed major increases and decreases of returnee population compared to Round 37.










