The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic at the beginning of 2020 has affected global and regional mobility, including mobility in the DTM REMAP project countries, through various travel disruptions and restrictions.


To better understand how the pandemic affects global mobility, the International Organization for Migration (IOM) developed an online tool and database to register points of entry, exit and transit - such as airports and land and blue border crossing points - where mobility restrictions and preparedness and response measures are in place. To support these efforts, over a period of 18 months, the Displacement Tracking Matrix Regional Evidence for Migration Analysis and Policy (DTM REMAP) national teams mapped and gathered data on the locations, statuses and restrictions at Points of Entry (PoE) in the project countries.

The information gathered allows more in-depth analysis to uncover specific trends related to the locations, statuses and restrictions of PoEs in these countries.

During the reporting period, the number of assessed PoEs in the DTM REMAP project countries gradually increased from 155 to 209¹ PoEs.

The most common type of PoE reported in August 2021 was land borders (111), followed by airports (73) and blue borders (25). Areas of interest, populations of interest and internal transit points were also assessed but were not taken into account for further analysis in this snapshot.


Timeline of confirmed national COVID-19 cases (weekly change) by country and status of PoEs



- 29 April 2021** Afghan government closes the Islam Qala border crossing with Iran (Islamic Republic of) for passengers but keeps open for trade
- 04 May 2021** Taliban launch major Afghan offensive in Helmand after deadline for U.S. pullout
- 9 July 2021** Taliban capture Islam Qala and Torghundi border crossings
- 14 July 2021** Pakistan seals border with Afghanistan after Taliban take control of Wesh border town
- 06 August 2021** Taliban close Chaman-Spin Boldak border crossing with Pakistan, call for visa-free travel for Afghans
- 11 August 2021** Taliban take control of borders with Uzbekistan and Tajikistan
- 15 August 2021** Taliban take over Kabul and announce the restoration of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan
- 16 August 2021** Chaos and casualties at Kabul Airport as it becomes hotspot of evacuations of foreign nationals and Afghans who assisted foreign missions
- 17 August 2021** Thousands of Afghans enter Pakistan via Chaman border crossing
- 26 August 2021** More than 100 people killed in blasts outside Kabul airport. Evacuation flights resume next day
- 31 August 2021** Conclusion of US/NATO troop withdrawal

Disclaimer: Please be aware that, due to COVID-19 diagnostic and reporting challenges in Afghanistan, the WHO official source may underestimate the actual prevalence of COVID-19 cases in the country. Therefore, it is not possible to positively correlate border closures with the low COVID-19 caseload reported.



- 05 April 2021** Government imposes a lockdown (extended until 16 May 2021) and bans domestic travel. Industries and emergency services allowed to operate
- 11 April 2021** Government bans international travel between 14 and 20 April 2021 (extended to 5 May 2021 but amended to 30 April 2021)
- 25 April 2021** Government closes border with India for 14 days and reopens shops and malls
- 21 April 2021** Limited domestic flights allowed to operate
- 04 May 2021** Passenger movement through land borders with India remains restricted until 9 May 2021
- 22 May 2021** Government extends ban on land border movement with India (on 14 June 2021 further extended to 30 June 2021)
- 30 June 2021** Suspension of domestic flights between 1 and 7 July 2021
- 01 July 2021** Due to Eid al-Adha festivity, the complete lockdown established on 01 July 2021 is lifted. It is reinstated after Eid on 23 July 2021
- 15 July 2021** Government imposes complete lockdown across the country until 15 July 2021, due to outbreak of COVID-19 delta variant
- 11 August 2021** International passenger flights resume their regular operation
- 16 August 2021** Lockdown is lifted and passenger movement across land borders with India is permitted from 14 August 2021



- 06 April 2021** Government categorizes Tehran and more than 40 other cities as red zones
- 10 April 2021** Government imposes ten day lockdown in 23 of 31 provinces
- 14 April 2021** Suspension of flights to/from France
- 24-28 April 2021** Suspension of flights to/from India and Pakistan and partial closure of Taftan border crossing with Pakistan
- 25 June 2021** Taftan border opens for travellers with COVID-19 vaccinations or negative test results
- 30 June 2021** Government closes Taftan and Raimdan border crossings to prevent COVID-19 spread
- 03 July 2021** Government categorizes 92 cities as red, 183 as orange and 173 as yellow
- 10 July 2021** Strict border restrictions are in place. Only certain government authorised groups are permitted to cross
- 18 July 2021** Borders with Afghanistan are closed for 5 days due to the upcoming Eid al-Adha festivity
- 07 August 2021** Milak border remains closed due to conflict in Afghanistan
- 11 August 2021** All borders with Afghanistan are opened
- 14 August 2021** Private vehicles are not allowed to travel between cities that are in the red or orange category
- 15 August 2021** All travelers entering the country, regardless of vaccinations, must have a negative COVID-19 test certificate



- 04 March 2021** GOI removes ban on entry from certain countries. Establishes mandatory COVID-19 testing and quarantine OR full vaccination to travel
- 10 March 2021** KRG closes cafes, clubs and bars 00:01-6:00 and cinemas completely. Mandatory COVID-19 testing to enter from other Iraqi governorates
- 22 March 2021** GOI reduces nightly curfew imposed on 18 February 2021 to 21:00-5:00 Mon-Thu, maintains full curfew Fri-Sun, allows malls, markets and dining places to reopen and bans entry of all tourists
- 29 March 2021** GOI imposes use of masks in public spaces, closes markets and malls, allows dining places to serve outdoors, prohibits gatherings in confined spaces and travel between FI and KRI Thu-Sat
- 12 April 2021** GOI imposes restrictions for Ramadan (14 April-14 May 2021): full lockdown Fri-Sat and 20:00-5:00 Sun-Thu, mandatory COVID-19 testing or full vaccination to enter public offices and schools back online
- 21 April 2021** GOI eases Ramadan restrictions: reopens selected businesses and allows free movement of residents in Baghdad 6:00-19:00
- 12 May 2021** GOI imposes lockdown 12-22 May 2021: curfew and mandatory closure of most businesses
- 14 May 2021** GOI lifts full lockdown imposed two days earlier and establishes curfew 21:00-6:00. Dining and leisure centres remain closed during Eid al-Fitr
- 06 July 2021** Rockets hit Erbil International Airport
- 08 July 2021** GOI modifies nightly curfew 23:00-5:00. Dining places and leisure centres required to remain closed
- 14 July 2021** Iraqi citizens included in list of banned nationalities to enter Bahrain

- 05 March 2021** Government introduces new requirements for inbound travelers: provide contact information through the PassTrack app, undergo screening by a health official and provide a certificate of negative COVID-19 test
- 19 April 2021** Pakistan bans travelers from India for two weeks
- 24 April 2021** Extended travel restrictions for international passengers arriving from 23 category C countries
- 01 May 2021** The CAA suspends flights for two weeks on Eid al-Fitr, mainly from Middle East
- 03 May 2021** Pakistan tightens borders as COVID-19 cases soar
- 01 June 2021** Pakistan and China open the Khunjerab pass for trade and travel activities from China to Pakistan only
- 25 June 2021** Taftan border with the Islamic Republic of Iran opened for all travelers, except pilgrims, with COVID-19 vaccination as a pre-requisite
- 02 July 2021** Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) issues warning to foreign airlines to suddenly cancel flights
- 22 July 2021** Traffic on Karakoram Highway remains suspended for second consecutive day
- 06 August 2021** Taliban close the Chaman crossing, border between Afghanistan and Pakistan, demanding visa-free travel for Afghans
- 19 August 2021** Pakistan opens doors to Afghan and foreign diplomats and officials
- 25 August 2021** China closes border with Pakistan after temporary opening
