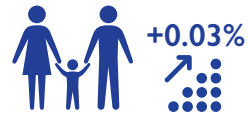
RETURNEE POPULATION DASHBOARD

DECEMBER 2021 ROUND 39

This dashboard presents the key figures on the returnee population tracked during Round 39 of DTM assessments in Nigeria's north-east geopolitical zone. Between 30 August and 15 October 2021, an estimated 1,943,445 returnees were identified - divided in 314,732 households - across 683 return locations in the states of Borno, Adamawa and Yobe. The Round 39 figure presents an increase of 25,382 returnees or one per cent compared to Round 38 when 1,918,063 returnees were identified. This dashboard highlights the number of returnees per state, the demographic composition of the returnee population in north-east Nigeria, states of displacement and reasons for initial displacement of returnees. Additionally, this dashboard presents an overview of the LGA's that witnessed major increases and decreases of returnee population compared to Round 38.

The DTM has identified a returnee population of **1,943,445** individuals as of 15 October 2021

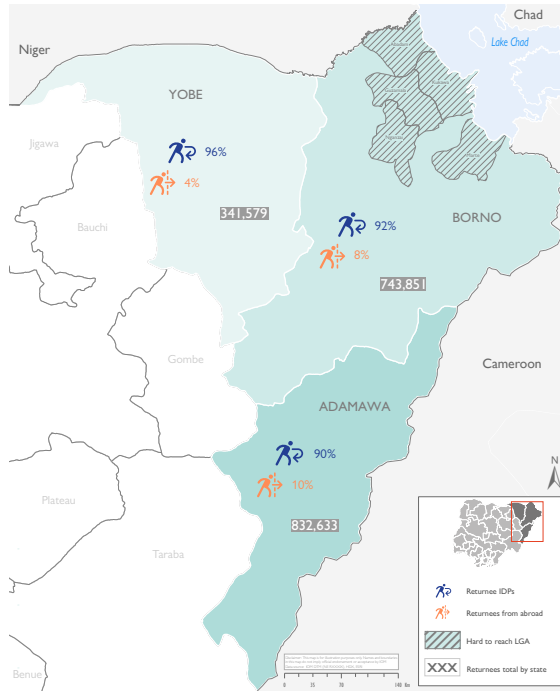

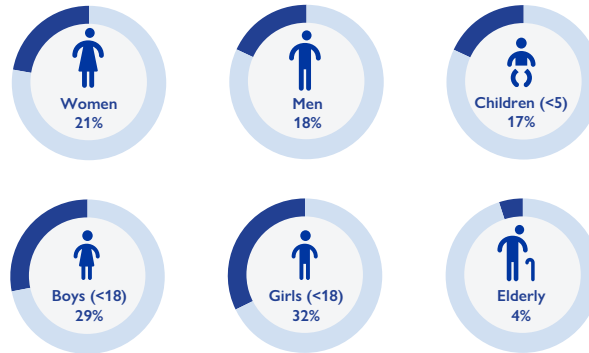

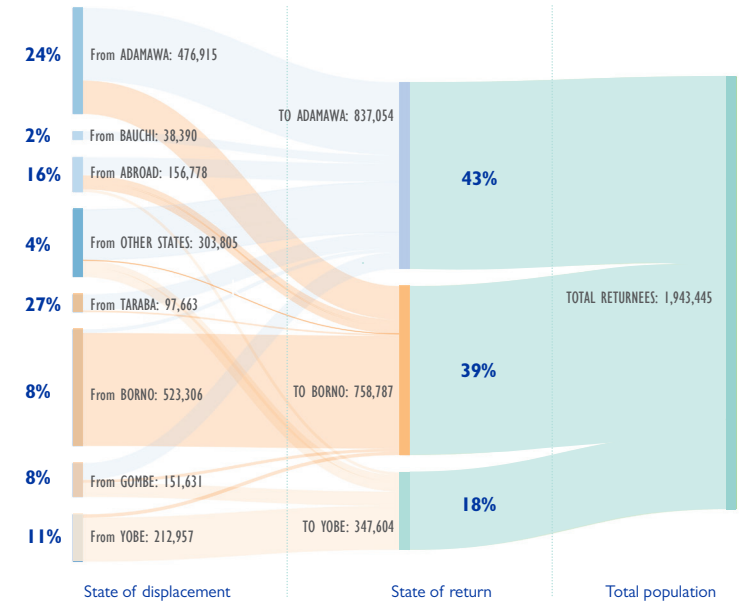

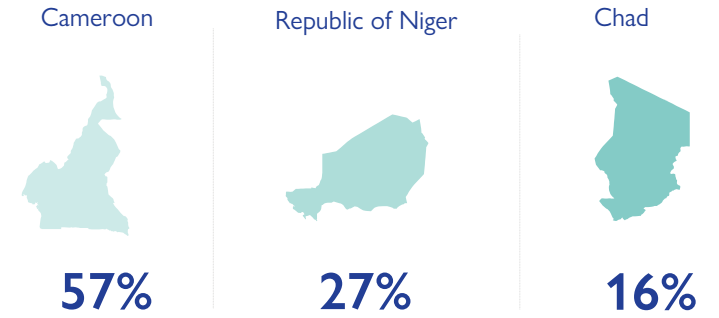

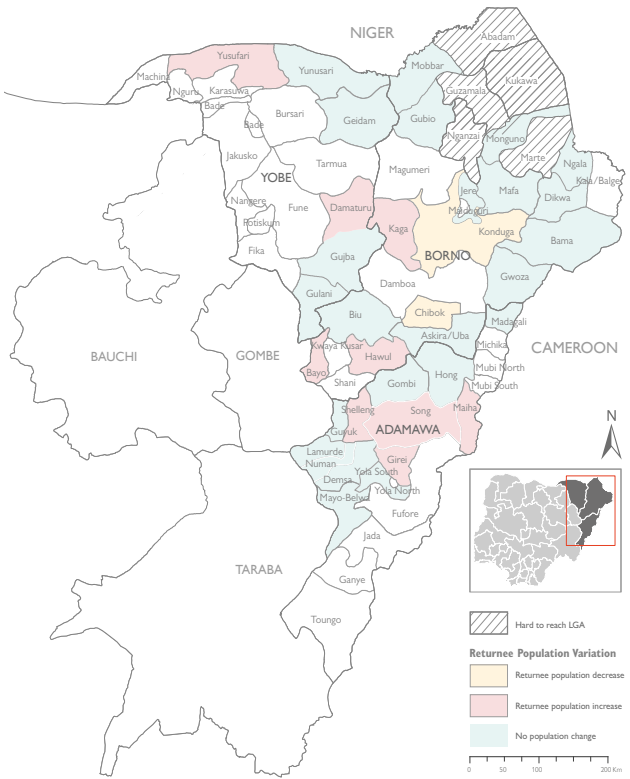

| Reasons | Mobbar: The returnee population increased as a result of improved security in Damasak and Zulum Umorti wards of Mobbar LGAs. |

| Reasons | Chibok: The returnee population decreased a result of fear of attacks in Korongilum ward of Chibok LGA. |

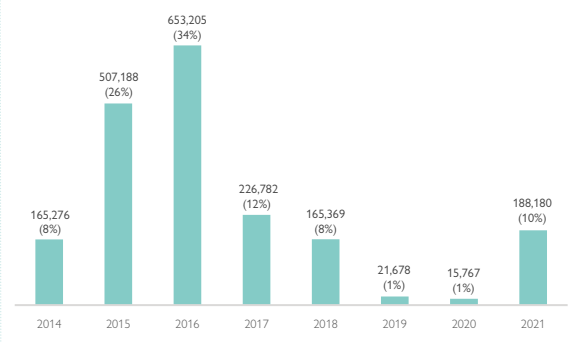

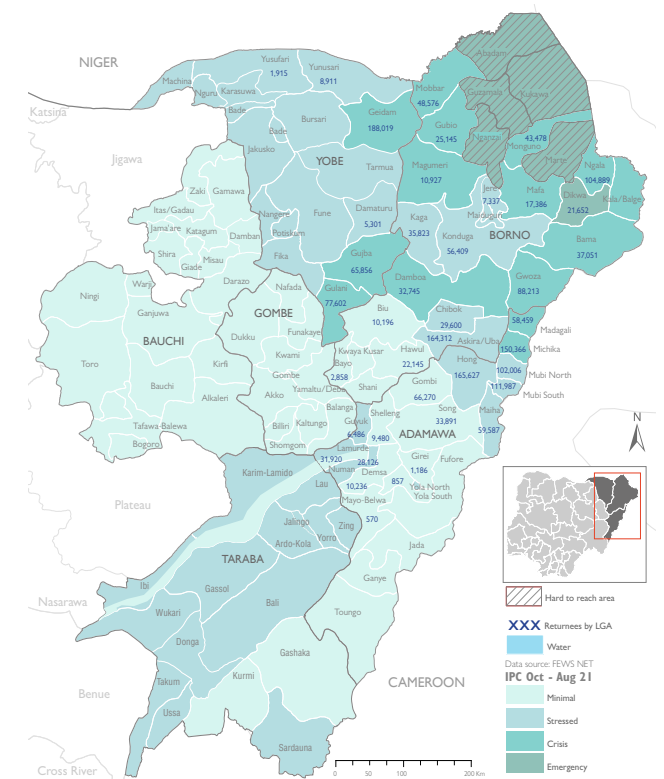
Returnee population variation



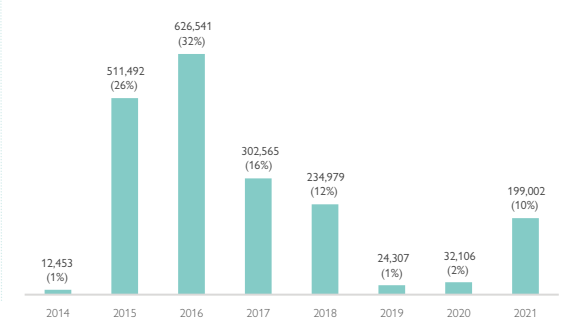
Returnees per year of displacement:
