









IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of origin or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks returnees who returned to their location of


During the reporting period, between 09 and 15 January 2022, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 315 households (HH) (1,890 individuals) displaced at least once. Conflict was the main reason for displacement, accounting for 97 per cent (304) HH) of the total, followed by economic reasons, accounting for three per cent (10 HH).

From 01 January to 15 January 2022, IOM Yemen DTM estimates that 1,237 households (7,422 individuals) have experienced displacement at least once.

Some 214 HH displaced in the previous reporting period, which covered 02 -08 January 2022, in the governorates of Al Hodeidah (81 HH), Ta'iz (64 HH), Ma'rib (43 HH), Al Maharah (23 HH) and Aden (3 HH), were only identified in the current reporting period. This figure has been added to the cumulative displacement total recorded from the beginning of the year.


DISPLACED HOUSEHOLDS BY LOCATION OF DISPLACEMENT AND DISTRICT OF ORIGIN
