MOVEMENT | NEW ARRIVALS SCREENING BY NUTRITION PARTNERS




Between the 10th and 16th of January 2022, a total of 3,287 movements were recorded in Adamawa and Borno States. The recorded movements consisted of 2,829 arrivals and 458 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Gwoza, Hawul, Kala/Balge, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected Borno State and in Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi South, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.


Departures were recorded in Askira Uba, Kala/Balge LGA of Borno, and Demsa, Fufore, Hong, Maiha, Michika, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: Voluntary relocation (1,594 individuals or 48%), poor living conditions (794 individuals or 24%), conflicts/attacks (398 individuals or 12%), improved security (343 individuals or 10%), camp closure/government-assisted relocation in Teachers Village and Bakassi Camps (110 individuals or 3%), fear of attack (28 individuals or 1%) and seasonal farming (20 individuals or 1%).



PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Bama: One thousand, four hundred and sixty-three (1,463) arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 1,210 individuals from within Bama LGA and 253 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon. Seventy-eight per cent (78%) of the movements recorded were due to voluntary relocation and 22 per cent were due to poor living conditions.

Askira/Uba: Two hundred and two (202) arrivals and 124 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 122 individuals from Madagali LGA in Adamawa State, 49 individuals from within Askira/Uba LGA, 16 individuals from Girei LGA in Adamawa State, 10 individuals from Hawul LGA in Borno State and 5 individuals from Hong LGA in Adamawa State. The departures included 97 individuals to locations within Askira/Uba LGA and twenty-seven (27) individuals to Mubi South LGA in Adamawa State. Forty-six per cent (46%) of the movements recorded resulted from improved security conditions in areas of origin, 37 per cent were a result of conflicts/attacks, and 16 per cent were due to poor living conditions.

Gwoza: Two hundred and sixty-three (263) arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 144 individuals from within Gwoza LGA, 61 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon, 32 individuals from Jere LGA and 26 individuals from Bama LGA in Borno State. Sixty-three per cent (63%) were due to conflicts/attacks and 37 per cent were a result of poor living conditions.

Gombi: One hundred and ninety-five (195) arrivals were recorded in Gombi LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 90 individuals from Madagali LGA in Adamawa State, 75 individuals from Hawul LGA in Borno State and 30 individuals from Mubi South LGA in Adamawa State. Forty-six per cent (46%) of the movements were due to conflicts/attacks, 38 per cent were a result of improved security conditions in areas of origin and 15 per cent were due to voluntary relocation.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6 - 59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 393 children of 6-59 months. Of the 393 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 23 children were recorded in the red category, 51 children in the yellow category and 319 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the four LGAs assessed.

The results also included 134 children who arrived from neighbouring countries (121 in Bama LGA and thirteen in Gwoza LGA). Of all the 134 children measured, none was recorded in the red category, twelve were in the yellow category, and 122 were in the green category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
