


ETT Report: No. 26 | 31 January - 06 February 2022

MOVEMENT | NEW ARRIVALS SCREENING BY NUTRITION PARTNERS




Between 31st January and the 06th February 2022, a total of 2,140 movements were recorded in Adamawa and Borno States. The recorded movements consisted of 1,966 arrivals and 174 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Gwoza, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected Borno State and in Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.


Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno, while in Fufore, Michika, Mubi North and Mubi South, Numan and Song LGAs of Adamawa State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: Voluntary relocation (1,154 individuals or 54%), poor living conditions (370 individuals or 17%), improved security (303 individuals or 14%), conflicts/attacks (282 individuals or 13%), involuntary relocation (17 individuals or 1%) and fear of attack (14 individuals or 1%).



PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Bama: Six hundred and two (602) arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 283 individuals from within Bama LGA and 319 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon. All movements recorded were due to voluntary relocation.

Gwoza: Four hundred and two (402) arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 400 individuals from within Gwoza LGA and 2 individuals from Bama LGA in Borno State. Fifty-one per cent (51%) were a result of conflicts/attacks and 49 per cent were due to poor living conditions.

Askira/Uba: Two hundred and fifty-nine (259) arrivals and 35 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 194 individuals from within Askira/Uba LGA, 41 individuals from Chibok LGA in Borno State and 24 individuals from Madagali LGA in Adamawa State. The departures included 17 individuals to Damboa LGA in Borno State, 13 individuals to Yola North LGA in Adamawa State and five (5) individuals to Bama LGA in Borno State. Eighty per cent (80%) of the movements recorded resulted from improved security conditions in areas of origin, 13 per cent were a result of voluntary relocation and 7 per cent were due to poor living conditions.

Gombi: One hundred and sixty-two (162) arrivals were recorded in Gombi LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 82 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon, 49 individuals from Madagali LGA and 31 individuals from Mubi North LGA in Adamawa State. Seventy per cent (70%) of the movements were due to voluntary relocation and 30 per cent were a result of conflicts/attacks.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6 - 59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 338 children of 6-59 months. Of the 338 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 25 children were recorded in the red category, 54 children in the yellow category and 259 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the four LGAs assessed.

The results also included 51 children who arrived from neighbouring countries (all in Bama LGA). Of all the 51 children measured, none was recorded in the red category, six were in the yellow category, and 45 were in the green category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
