




As part of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM resumed the second phase of the campaign by conducting the awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 1,361 adult migrants (1,067 males and 294 females) in one detention centre and community settings in three Municipalities during the reporting period (30 Jan - 5 Feb 2022).

Gender disaggregation of migrants attending C-19 awareness sessions by location





Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location




By 5 February 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Eritrea (21%), Egypt (19%) and Niger (14%).

Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated




Vaccines provided (in total)



By 5 February 2022, a total of 7,911 migrants (639 females and 7,272 males) have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 2,335 migrants (29%) have received two doses and are fully vaccinated (including the migrants who received the first dose before 3 October 2021). Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
