



**MOVEMENT** | **NEW ARRIVALS SCREENING BY NUTRITION PARTNERS**



Between 14 and 20 February 2022, a total of 2,131 movements were recorded in Adamawa and Borno States. The recorded movements consisted of 1,827 arrivals and 304 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected State of Borno and in Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba and Bama LGAs of Borno, and in Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Maiha, Mubi South, Song and Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (1,052 individuals or 49%), poor living conditions (515 individuals or 24%), improved security (302 individuals or 14%), military operations (222 individuals or 11%) and seasonal farming (40 individuals or 2%).

**SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS**

**Bama:** Eight hundred and eight (808) arrivals and 23 departures were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 680 individuals from within Bama LGA, 99 individuals from Fufore LGA in Adamawa State and 29 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon. All departures were to Ngala LGA in Borno State. Forty-five per cent (45%) of the movements were due to voluntary relocation, 37 per cent were a result of poor living conditions and 19 per cent were due to military operations.

**Gwoza:** One hundred and fifty-four (154) arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. All arrivals recorded were from other locations within Gwoza LGA. Fifty-six per cent (56%) of the movements were due to poor living conditions and 44 per cent were a result of military operations.

**Askira/Uba:** One hundred and nineteen (119) arrivals and 22 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 67 individuals from within Askira/Uba LGA, 36 individuals from Chibok LGA in Borno State and 16 individuals from Gombi LGA in Adamawa State. All departures were to Chibok LGA. All movements recorded resulted from improved security conditions in areas of origin.

**Hong:** Seventy-one (71) arrivals and 60 departures were recorded in Hong LGA of Adamawa State. All arrivals recorded were from other locations within Hong LGA. All departures were to other locations within Hong LGA. Seventy-six per cent (76%) of the movements were due to voluntary relocation and 24 per cent were a result of poor living conditions.

## NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6 - 59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 270 children of 6-59 months. Of the 270 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 32 children were recorded in the red category, 43 children in the yellow category and 195 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the five LGAs assessed.

The results also included 28 children who arrived from neighbouring countries (23 in Bama LGA and five in Monguno LGA). Of all the 28 children measured, 4 was recorded in the red category, none were in the yellow category, and 24 were in the green category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
