MOVEMENT NEW ARRIVALS SCREENING BY NUTRITION PARTNERS




Between 21 and 27 February 2022, a total of 2,664 movements were recorded in Adamawa and Borno States. The recorded movements consisted of 2,264 arrivals and 400 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Gwoza, Kala/Balge and Monguno Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected State of Borno and in Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State.


Departures were recorded in Fufore, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Maiha, Michika, Mubi South, Numan and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa State. No departures were recorded in Borno State.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: military operations (905 individuals or 34%), voluntary relocation (780 individuals or 29%), poor living conditions (563 individuals or 21%), camp closures/government relocation schemes (242 individuals or 9%), improved security (156 individuals or 6%) and seasonal farming (18 individuals or 1%).



PERCENTAGE OF INDIVIDUALS BY MOVEMENT TRIGGER

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Gwoza: Seven hundred and sixty-seven (767) arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 705 individuals from within Gwoza LGA and 62 individuals from Bama LGA in Borno State. Eighty-eight per cent (88%) of the movements were a result of military operations and 12 per cent were due to poor living conditions.

Bama: Seven hundred and eighteen (718) arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 594 individuals from within Bama LGA and 124 individuals from the Marwa region in Cameroon. Forty-six per cent (46%) of the movements were due to voluntary relocation, 32 per cent were due to military operations and 22 per cent were a result of poor living conditions.

Monguno: Two hundred and forty-two (242) arrivals were recorded in Monguno LGA of Borno State. All arrivals recorded were from Maiduguri Metropolitan Council LGA in Borno State. All movements recorded were due to camp closures/government relocation schemes.

Hong: Fifty (50) arrivals and 98 departures were recorded in Hong LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 28 individuals from Maiha LGA in Adamawa State and 22 individuals from within Hong LGA. The departures included 52 individuals to Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State and 46 individuals to other locations within Hong LGA. Fifty-three per cent (53%) of the movements were due to voluntary relocation, 35 per cent were a result of poor living conditions and 12 per cent were due to seasonal farming.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6 - 59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using Mid-Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 300 children of 6-59 months. Of the 300 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 24 children were recorded in the red category, 42 children in the yellow category and 234 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the four LGAs assessed.

The results also included 21 children who arrived from neighbouring countries (19 in Bama LGA and 2 in Gwoza LGA). Of all the 21 children measured, none was recorded in the red category, two were in the yellow category, and 19 were in the green category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
