

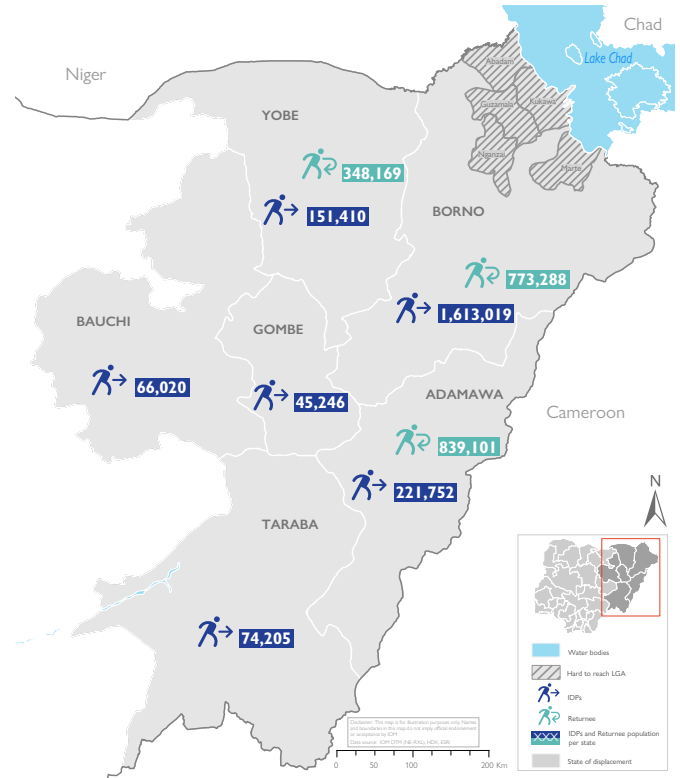

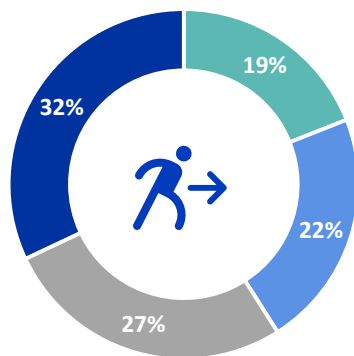

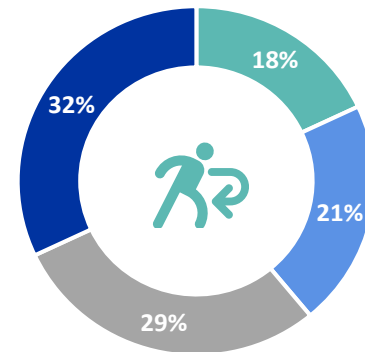

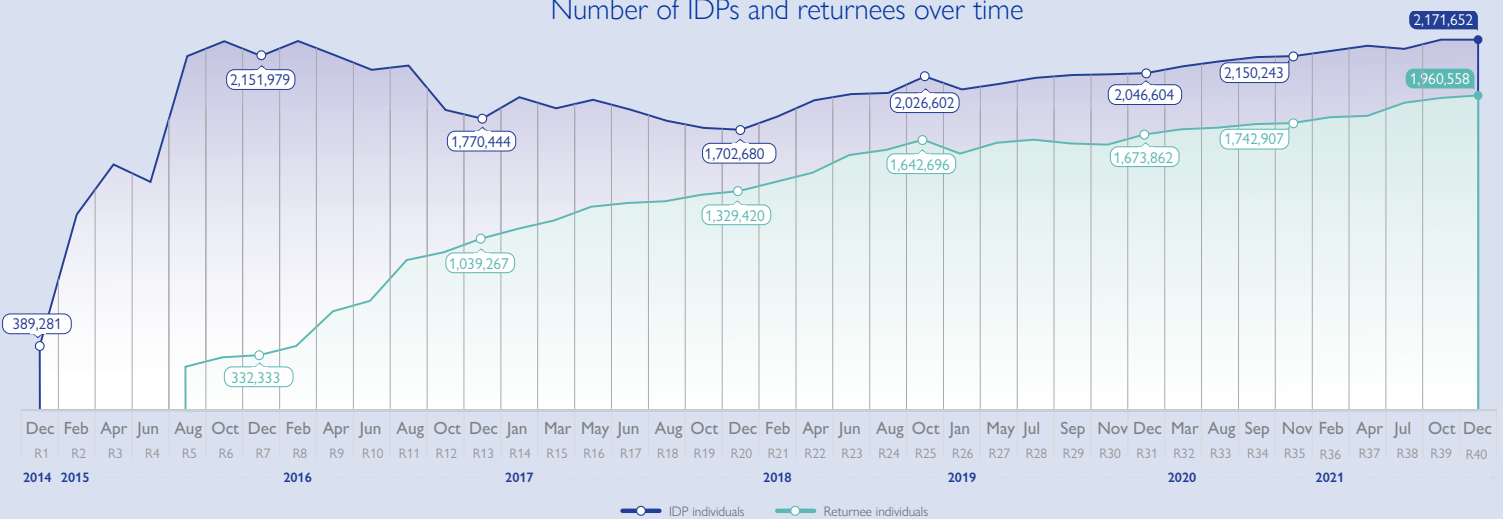

All the numbers presented in this report are based on the areas that were accessible at the time of the assessment

Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs): Persons or groups of persons who have been forced or obliged to flee or to leave their homes or places of habitual residence, in particular as a result of or in order to avoid the effects of armed conflict, situations of generalized violence, violations of human rights or natural or human-made disasters, and who have not crossed an internationally recognized State border.

Returnees: In the context of Nigeria, returnees include all persons who were displaced internally and have since returned to their place of habitual residence (IDP returnees) as well as former refugees, who crossed an international border, and have since returned to their country of origin (refugee returnees).
