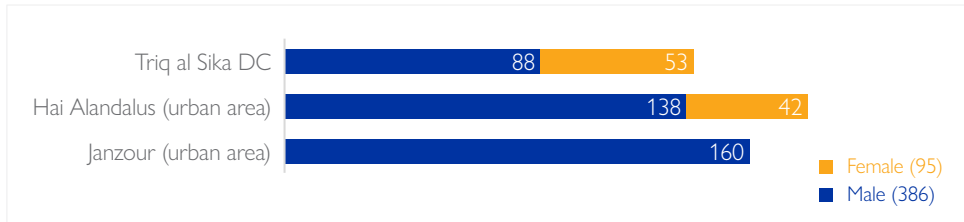


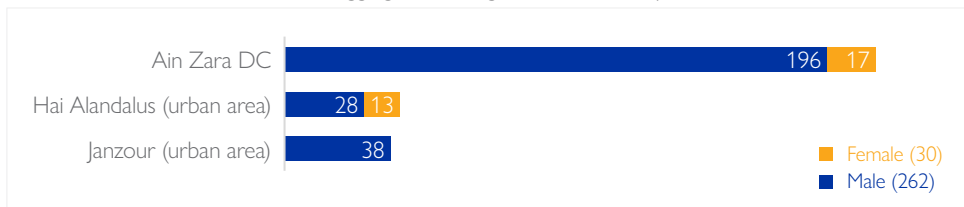
IOM LIBYA WEEKLY MIGRANT COVID-19 VACCINATION UPDATE - PHASE 2 (20 - 26 Mar 2022)

As part of the second phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 481 adult migrants (95 females and 386 males) in three locations, Triq al Sika detention centre and community settings in two municipalities during the reporting period (20 - 26 Mar 2022).

Gender disaggregation of migrants attending C-19 awareness sessions by location

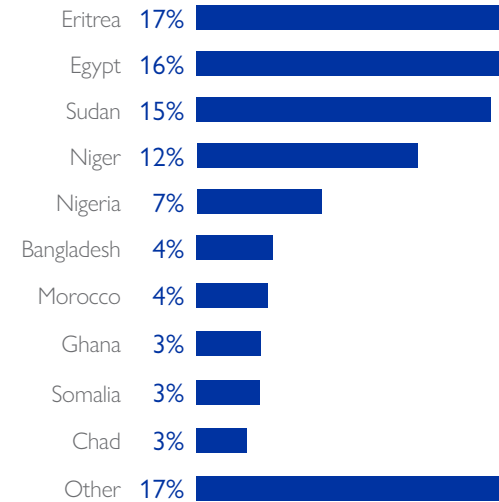


Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location



By 26 March 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Eritrea (17%), Egypt (16%) and Sudan (15%).

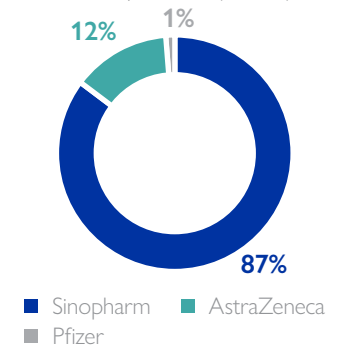

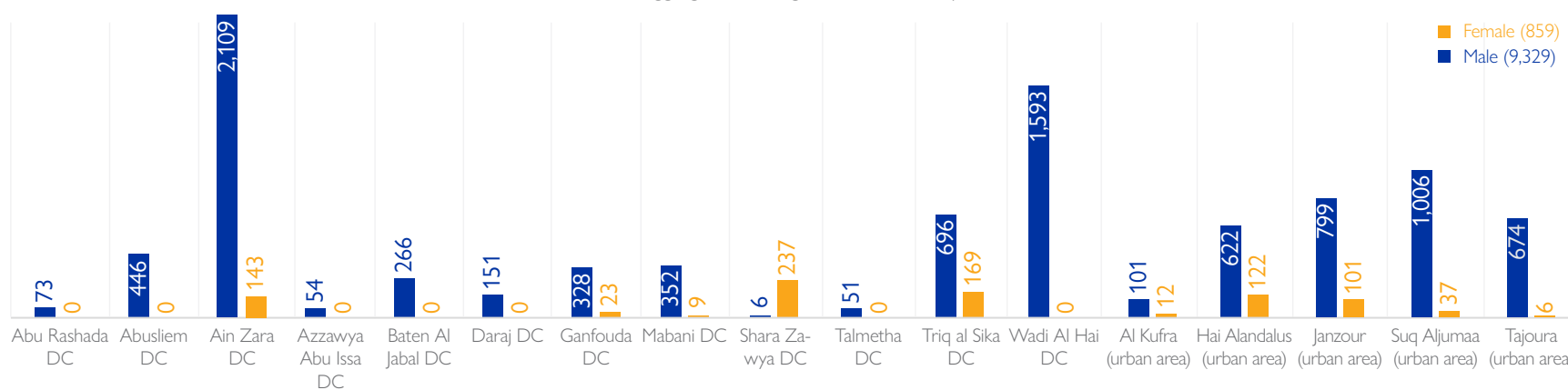

Vaccines provided (in total)



By 26 March 2022, a total of 10,188 migrants (859 females and 9,329 males) have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 2,684 migrants (26%) have received two doses (including the migrants who received the first dose before 3 October 2021). Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
