68% decrease in displacement from the previous week (126 HHs)

IOM Yemen DTM's Rapid Displacement Tracking (RDT) tool collects data on estimated numbers of households forced to flee on a daily basis from their locations of habitual residence or displacement, allowing for regular reporting of new displacements<sup>1</sup> in terms of estimated numbers, causes of displacement, geography and needs. It also tracks returnees who returned to their location of habitual residence.

During the reporting period, between 24 and 30 April 2022, IOM Yemen DTM tracked 40 households (HHs) (approximately 240 individuals<sup>2</sup>) displaced at least once.

Reported reasons for displacement were equally split between safety and security concerns as a result of the conflict, accounting for 50 per cent (20 HHs) of the total reasons for disaplacement, and economic reasons related to conflict, accounting for the remaining 50 per cent (20 HHs).

Between 1 January and 30 April 2022, IOM Yemen DTM tracked a cumulative 5,606 households (33,636 individuals) that experienced displacement at least once. Since the beginning of the year, the number of tracked new instances of displacement has been declining steadily.


IOM identified 10 households displaced in the previous reporting period, which covered 17 to 23 April 2022, in the governorates of Ma'rib (6 HHs) and Al Hodeidah (4 HHs). These figures have been added to the cumulative displacement total recorded since the beginning of the year.3

- 1. Displacement in Yemen refers to the 13 governorates where IOM DTM's team has access, namely: Abyan, Ad Dalí, Aden, Al Bayda, Al Hodeidah, Al Jawf, Al Maharah, Hadramawt, Lahj, Ma'rib, Shabwah, Socotra, Ta'iz.




