

# IOM LIBYA WEEKLY MIGRANT & HOST COMMUNITIES COVID-19 VACCINATION UPDATE - PHASE 3 (18-28 May 2022)

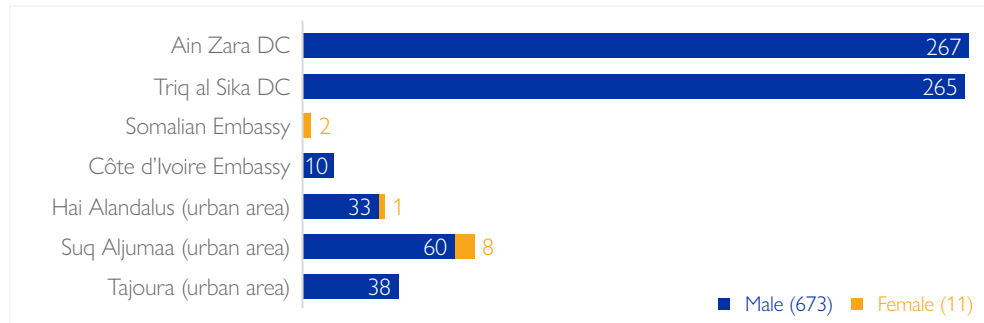
As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 1150 adult migrants in six locations, Triq al Sika, Triq al Matar, and Ain Zara detention centres and community settings in three municipalities, Hai Alandalus, Suq Aljumaa and Tajoura.

Additionally, 694 (684 migrants and 10 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in seven locations during the reporting period (18 - 28 May 2022).

Gender disaggregation of vaccinated migrants and host communities

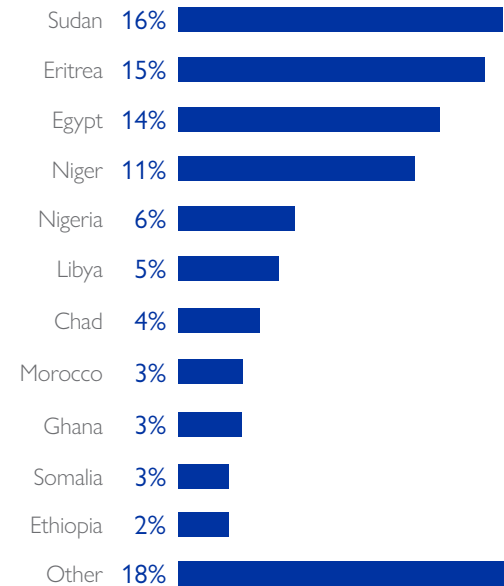


Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location



By 28 May 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Sudan (16%), Eritrea (15%) and Egypt (14%).

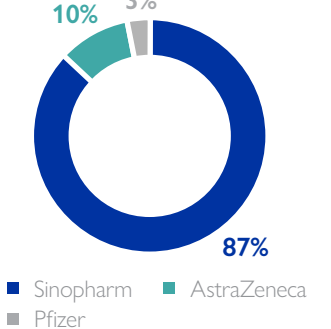

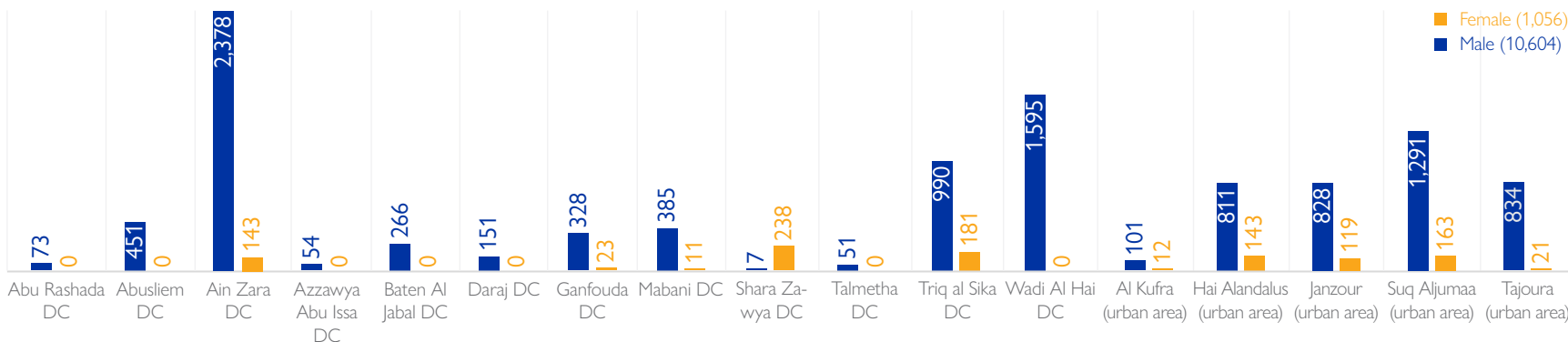

Vaccines provided (in total)



By 28 May 2022, a total of 11,660 persons (1056 females and 10,604 males) including 11,069 migrants and 591 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 2,821 migrants (25%) have received two doses and 395 (4%) have received two doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
