

IOM LIBYA WEEKLY MIGRANT & HOST COMMUNITIES COVID-19 VACCINATION UPDATE - PHASE 3 (5 - 11 June 2022)

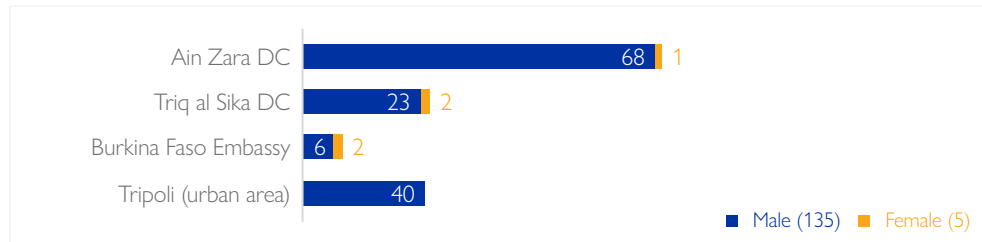
As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 148 adult migrants (13 Females and 135 Males) in two detention centres and a community setting in Tripoli municipality.

Additionally, 142 (140 migrants and 2 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in four locations during the reporting period (5 - 11 June 2022).

Gender disaggregation of vaccinated migrants and host communities

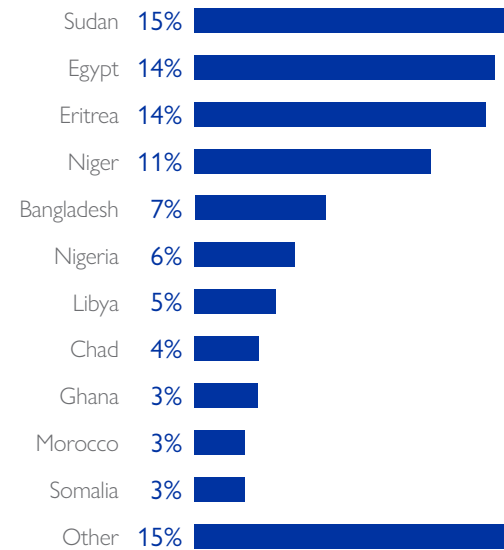


Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location



By 11 June 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Sudan (15%), Egypt (14%) and Eritrea (14%).

Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated

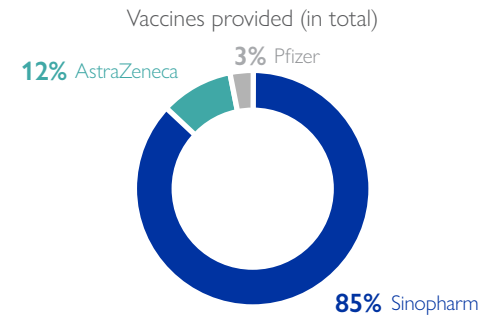

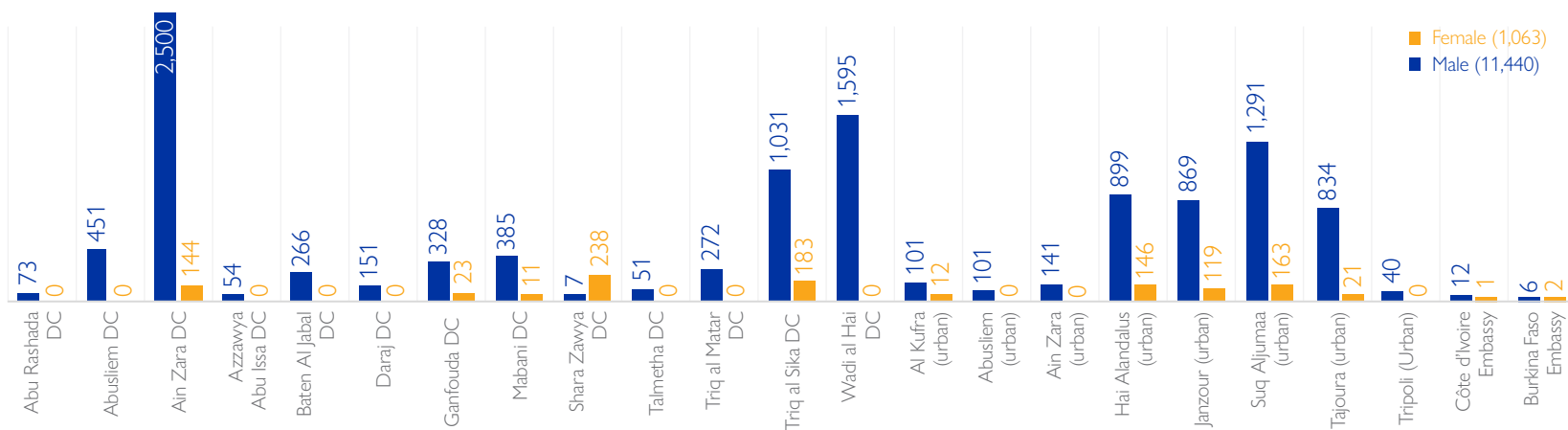

By 11 June 2022, a total of 12,503 persons (1,063 females and 11,440 males) including 11,896 migrants and 607 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,250 migrants (26%) have received two doses and 627 (5%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
