**3 BCPs on the land border with Ukraine**
**30,845 TCNs ENTERED from Ukraine**
**18,434 TCNs EXITED the country**

Since 24 February 2022, an increasing number of persons fleeing from Ukraine to the neighbouring countries has been observed, as a result of the war in Ukraine.

This report is based on cumulative and daily registrations by the Bureau of Border and Foreign Police of the Presidium of the Police Force (BBFP) of Ukrainian refugees and third-country nationals (TCNs) entering from Ukraine to the territory of Slovakia through all Border Crossing Points (BCPs), since 24 February 2022, numbers of those who exited the country towards Ukraine, as well as on number of those who applied for asylum or temporary protection in Slovakia.

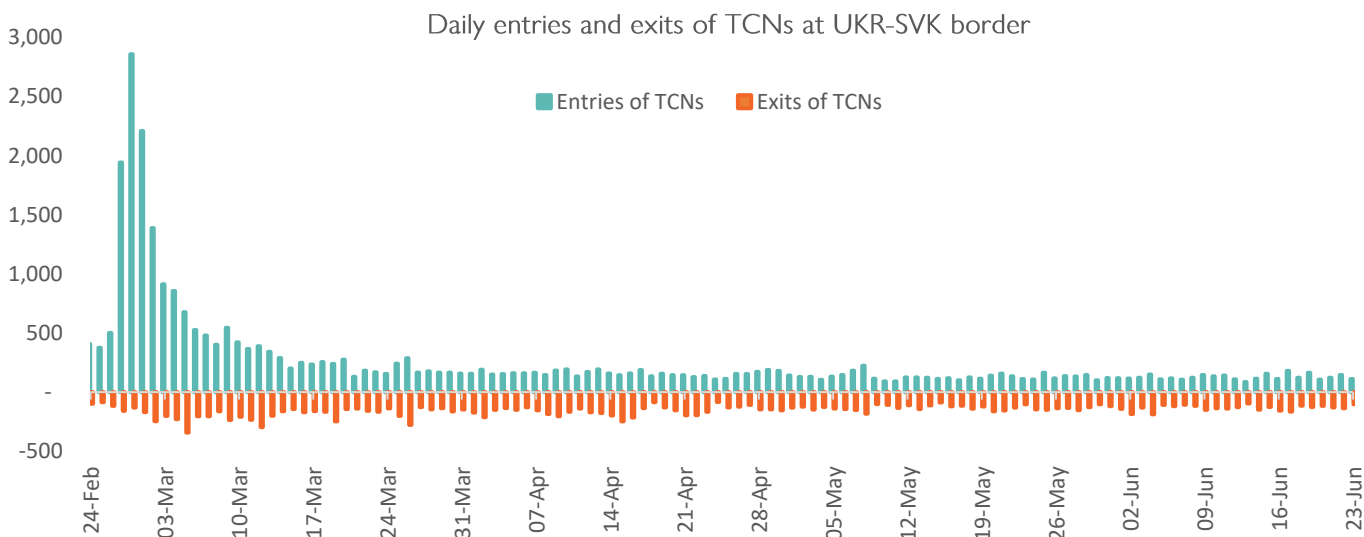
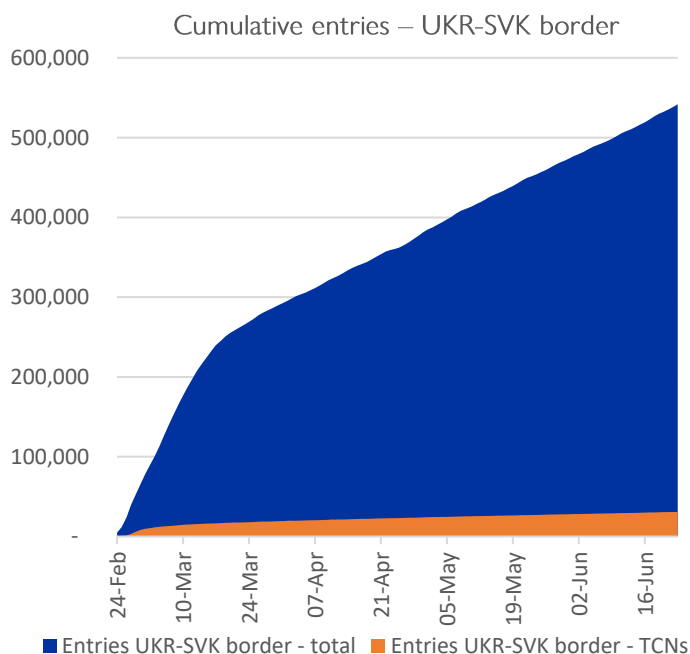
### Third-country nationals represent 6% of all entries from Ukraine so far

To date, Ukrainian refugees represent 92 per cent (501,059) of all individuals registered at entry from Ukraine to Slovakia, with 6 per cent (30,845) of Third-Country Nationals (TCNs) and 2 per cent (9,822) of Slovak nationals recorded.

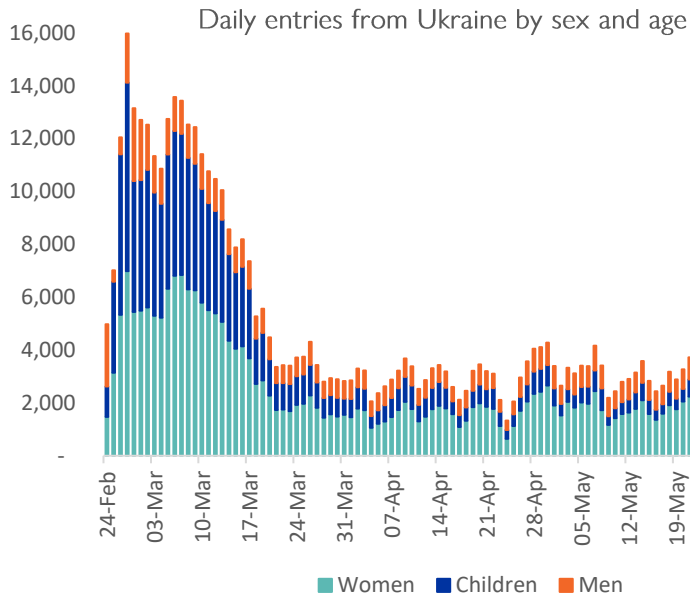
Similarly, Ukrainian refugees represent 90 per cent of all individuals (260,369) registered while leaving Slovakia towards Ukraine during the reporting period, with 6 per cent (18,434) of TCNs and 4 per cent of Slovak nationals (9,818) recorded leaving towards Ukraine.

Almost 50 per cent of the entries of TCNs occurred before 10 March, with a peak of entries (8,391) between 27 February and 2 March 2022.

This report focuses on trends of TCNs from Ukraine to Slovakia, analyzing data on nationalities, asylum applications and requests of temporary protection.

#### Demographics of entries from Ukraine

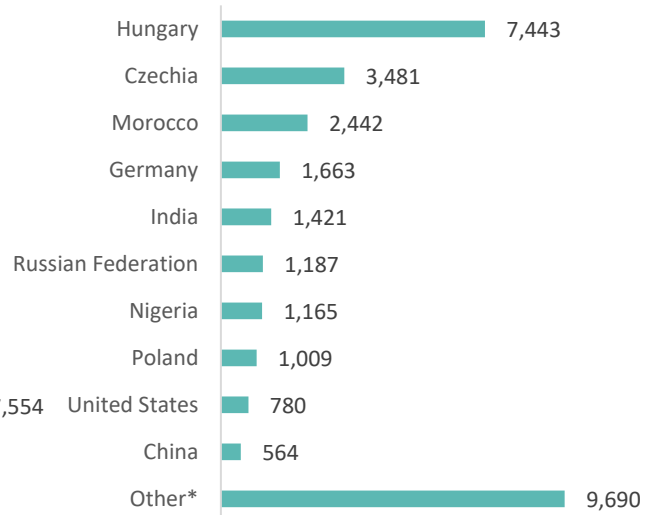
According to the national authorities, between 24 February and 23 June 2022, a total of 541,726 individuals entered Slovakia from Ukraine. More than half of the persons who entered Slovakia were women (284,154) with 29 per cent of children (79,020 girls and 78,814 boys) and 19 per cent of men (99,738).



#### Entries from Ukraine to Slovakia

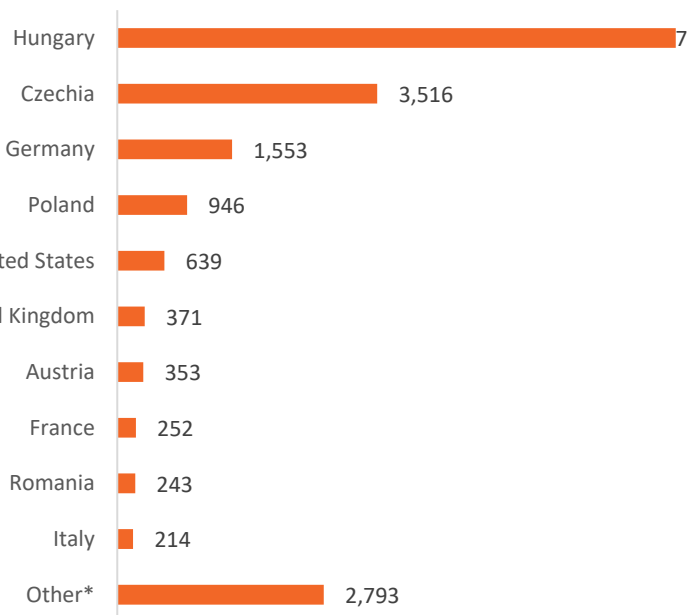
Between 24 February and 23 June 2022, 30,845 TCNs of 149 different nationalities entered Slovakia from Ukraine, in addition to 501,059 Ukrainian and 9,822 Slovak nationals. Of these, the top 10 nationalities by number of entries in Slovakia were Hungary (24% of the total number of TCNs), Czechia (11%), Morocco (8%), Germany (5%), India (5%), Russian Federation (4%), Nigeria (4%), Poland (3%), United States (3%) and China (2%).

#### Exits from Slovakia towards Ukraine

In the reporting period, a total of 18,434 TCNs of 96 different nationalities left Slovakia towards Ukraine, in addition to 260,369 Ukrainian and 9,818 Slovak nationals. Of these, the top 10 nationalities of TCNs by number of individuals leaving Slovakia towards Ukraine so far were Hungary (41% of the total number of TCNs), Czechia (19%), Germany (8%), Poland (5%), United States of America (3%), United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (2%), Austria (2%), France (1%), Romania (1%) and Italy (1%).

### Asylum applications

Between 24 February and 23 June 2022, Slovakia received a total of 190 asylum applications in connection with the conflict in Ukraine. Out of these, the majority were from Ukrainian nationals (146 asylum applications, including 41 women, 17 men and 88 children) and 23 per cent from TCNs.

Concerning TCNs, in the reporting period Slovakia received a total of 44 asylum applications from persons of nine different nationalities.

In particular, nationals of the Russian Federation represented almost 60 per cent (26 applications) of the asylum applications from TCNs, followed by Nigeria (6 asylum applications), Belarus (4), Lebanon (2), Tajikistan (2) Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Islamic Republic of Iran and Morocco (1 asylum application each).

Adults represented 82 per cent (21 men and 15 women) of the asylum applications from TCNs in the reporting period. In addition, eight children (7 from Russian Federation and 1 from Belarus) applied for asylum in Slovakia so far.

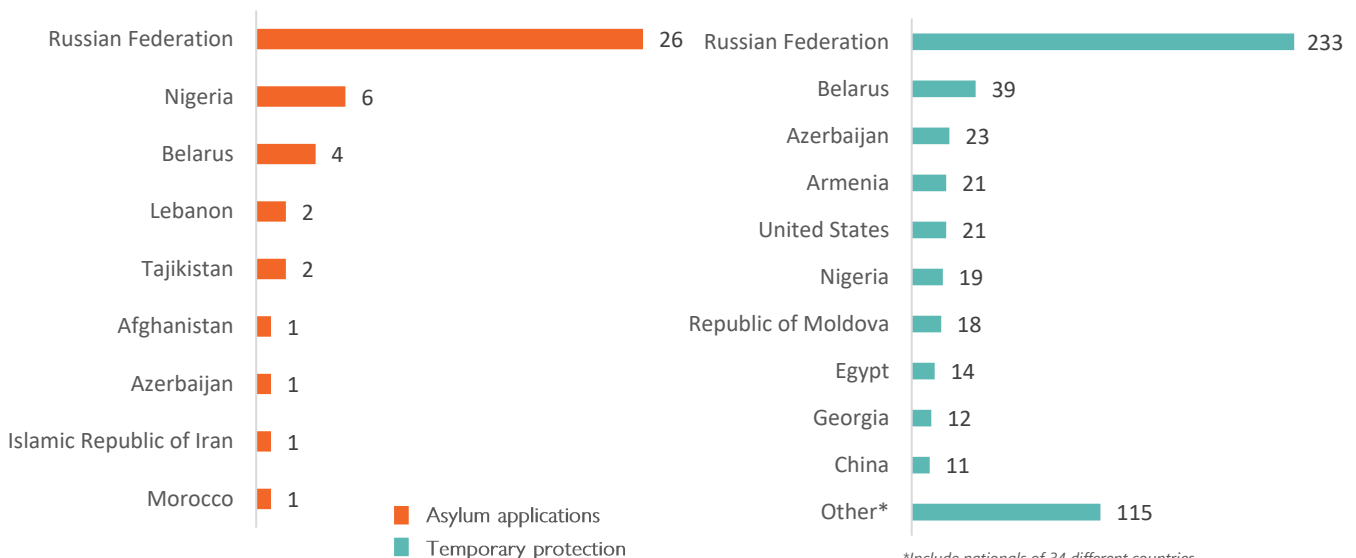
### Temporary protection

Between 24 February and 23 June 2022, a total of 82,799 persons requested temporary protection in the territory of Slovakia in connection with the conflict in Ukraine. Out of these, the vast majority were from Ukrainian nationals (82,273 requests, or 99.4%) and less than 1 per cent from TCNs.

Concerning TCNs, 526 requests of temporary protection from persons of 44 different nationalities were received by Slovakia in the reporting period.

Similarly to asylum applications, after Ukrainians, nationals of the Russian Federation were the largest nationality group to request temporary protection: 233 requests (44% of the total number of requests of temporary protection by TCNs). It was followed by nationals of Belarus (7%), Azerbaijan (4%), Armenia (4%), United States of America (4%), Nigeria (4%), Republic of Moldova (3%), Egypt (3%), Georgia (2%) and China (2%).
