
- Since 24 February 2022, over 2.7 million Ukrainian refugees and third country nationals have entered Poland as a result of war in Ukraine.
- This report is based on a displacement patterns, needs and intentions survey launched by IOM's DTM Surveys are conducted face-to-face by trained enumerators for DTM at PGE Stadion Narodowy in Warsaw with Ukrainian Refugees registering for a PESEL. Data is collected and stored through Kobo, a mobile application.
- This report presents an analysis based on the data collected from 1 to 11 April 2022.

Key Findings:


- 79% of Ukrainians want to work in Warsaw but only 28% of them have found a potential employer.
- 47% arrived in Poland more than a month ago.
- 60% want assistance finding livelihoods, and 54% need financial support.
- 51% can stay in their current accommodation as long as they need.


Are you traveling alone or in a group?



Who was in the group?




Demographics breakdown for those who were travelling with the respondents




Do you have sufficient funds to continue living in Warsaw?



Do you want to find a job/employment in Warsaw?





Have you found a potential employer in Warsaw?










Top destinations for those who intended to go outside Poland




Top destinations for those who intended to stay in Poland



Why did you choose to Poland as your final destination?




When did you come to Poland?




