

METHODOLOGY : Data is collected by direct observation or by phone, from key informants, principally local authorities, in affected areas

The objective of the Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is to collect information on large and sudden population movements as well as security and climatic emergencies. Every year in Chad, during the rainy season (which is currently underway), several localities are often affected by floods affecting thousands of people. This dashboard provides information on flooding which occurred at end of July 2022 in 15 localities in the provinces of Mayo-Kebbi Ouest and Sila, affecting 1,359 households (6,942 individuals). This information was collected through phone interviews with key informants, mainly local authorities in the affected provinces.

1. Following **heavy rains on 26 and 30 of July 2022, thirteen villages, located in the sous-préfectures of Leré and Guegou (département of Lac Lééré, province of Mayo-Kebbi Ouest) were flooded. A total of 384 households (2,112 individuals) were affected by the flooding.** Among these households, the homes of 112 households were completely destroyed; these households now reside with other members of the community who were not affected by the floods. The homes of the remaining affected households (272 households) were partially damaged. At the time of data collection, these households continued to reside in these homes. Following heavy rains, and the subsequent rise in the Bahr Azoum River's water level on the night of 30 July 2022, a **total of 975 households (4,830 individuals) were affected by floods in two localities located in the sous-préfecture of Koukou Andarana (département of Koukou Andarana, province of Sila).** Among these households, the homes of 390 households (1,905 individuals), residing in the locality of Koukou centre, were completely destroyed and they took refuge on a hill located in the locality considering that given its height, it would not be affected by probable flooding in coming weeks. The houses of 585 other households (2,925 individuals), residing in the locality of Habilé, were partially damaged. SUMMARY ANALYSIS BY SECTOR



In the province of Mayo-Kebbi Ouest, among the 384 households (2,112 individuals) who were affected by the floods, 112 completely lost their homes and took refuge in houses of other members of the community who were not affected by the floods, while the homes of the other 272 households were partially damaged. At the time of the data collection, the latter continued to reside in their houses.



In the province of Sila, all the 390 households (1,905 individuals) affected in the locality of Koukou centre lost their shelters and took refuge on a hill in the locality, where they sleep in the open air. In addition, although the shelters of the 585 households (2,925 individuals) affected in the locality of Habilé were partially damaged, they took refuge in houses of other members of the community whose homes were not destroyed.



In the province of Mayo-Kebbi Ouest, the rice, millet and maize fields, which were the main sources of subsistence for the affected households, were totally destroyed. **About 1,660 hectares of arable land were flooded.** In the province of Sila, key informants reported the loss of agricultural stocks of all affected households.



Cases of malaria have been reported especially in the *sous-préfecture* of Koukou Andarana (province of Sila), in the locality of Koukou centre where all 390 affected households took refuge on a hill in the locality where they are homeless.



Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) assisted the people who took refuge on a hill in the locality of Koukou centre (Sila province) with water. However, the need for water remains important. Moreover, due to the absence of latrines in this place, these people are forced to defecate in the open air.

In the two affected provinces, affected households lost most of their Non-Food Items. **Priority needs are blankets, mosquito nets, mats and cooking utensils.**
