Displacement Tracking Matrix Monthly Factsheet August 2017





The Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) is IOM's primary suite of tools used to track and monitor displacement and population mobility in over 60 countries around the world including Sudan. During the month of August 2017, IOM DTM teams conducted 17 field missions, covering 140 sites/villages, to register and verify different caseloads of IDPs, returnees, refugees and affected host communities in the states of North Darfur, South Darfur, Central Darfur, South Kordofan, and West Kordofan. A total of 90,513 individuals were registered during these missions. All DTM activities are conducted in collaboration with the Humanitarian Aid Commission (HAC), the Area / Humanitarian Country Team (A/HCT) and partners on the ground.


13 missions are initially planned for September, consisting of 4 in North Darfur, 5 in South Darfur, 2 in South Kordofan, and 2 in Central Darfur. More than 13 sites to be visited by the planned missions.

153 sites (villages) visited / planned to be visited in these missions



DTM teams completed 17 registration missions in August, consisting of 3 missions in North Darfur, 1 in South Darfur, 2 in Central Darfur, 5 in West Kordofan and 6 in South Kordofan. 140 sites visited in these 17 missions.



- in Central Darfur, South Kordofan and North Darfur States. A total of 8,532 returnees were registered in the Rashad and Dalami localities, South Kordofan, whereas the biggest caseload of returnees was registered in Rokoro, Central Darfur, comprised of 41,819 individuals, most of whom had returned in 2016.
- The registered returnees included IDP and refugee returnees. The refugee returnees were identified in Um Baru, Tina and Kornoi localities, North Darfur. While Rokero in Central Darfur, Dalami and Rashad in South Kordofan, and the remaining returnees registered in North Darfur were identified as IDP returnees.
- 18,938 returnees have been registered in 9 localities of North Darfur State, since January 2017 to date. This cumulative figure of returnees registered in North Darfur during 2017 is not added to the monthly figures.


Individuals

- A total of 20,690 South Sudanese refugees were registered during the month of August in South and West Kordofan states.
- In West Kordofan 19,161 refugees were registered at more than 140 sites (villages) in 5 localities. This mixed caseload consisted of new and old refugees.
- In South Kordofan 1,529 refugees were registered in Algouz, Dilling, Habila, Altadamon, Terter Watera. All refugees registered in South Kordofan were part of the new caseload of refugee arrivals.

- 5,106 IDPs were registered in Rokero, Central Darfur, 690 in Dalami, South Kordofan, and 232 in Tawilla, North Darfur State. Most of the IDPs registered were displaced in 2016 from Jabel Marra.

Tracking / Flow Monitoring Points (FMP)

South Kordofan: During August, a total of 57 IDPs and 260 South Sudanese refugees were tracked in different localities of South Kordofan State. The number of South Sudanese tracked by the DTM teams in South Kordofan further reduced during the month of August in comparison to the previous months.



Abyei: 1,682 South Sudanese were identified to pass through IOM Flow Monitoring Point (FMP) in Diffra (July 24 to August 28, 2017).

Returnees from KSA: Registration of the Sudanese nationals returning from Saudi Arabia is ongoing at both the Khartoum International Airport and at Sawakin sea port in the Red Sea State. Further details on the registration of this caseload will be included in next month's report.

Affected Population





The DTM teams registered 11,446 vulnerable host community members in Rokero, Central Darfur, and 1,998 individuals affected by floods and heavy rain in North and South Darfur. 1,724 individuals affected by floods were registered in Otash IDP Camp, South Darfur, whereas the remaining **274** individuals were registered in Kabkabyia and Shengle Tobay, North Darfur.

Note: The total figure of returnees and IDPs registered in August will increase after the addition of Golo re-verified figures that are currently being processed.
