




As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM and NCDC conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 2056 adult migrants (60 females and 1996 males) in community settings in three municipalities, and one detention center in Tripoli.

Additionally, 1068 (1047 migrants and 21 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in community settings in three municipalities and Triq al Sikka DC during the reporting period (3 - 30 July 2022).


Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location









By 30 July 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Sudan (16%), Egypt (14%) and Niger (14%).



By 30 July 2022, a total of 14,049 persons (1,094) females and 12,955 males) including 13,419 migrants and 630 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,317 people (23%) have received two doses and 659 (5%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
