

## Al Manaqil, Al Jazirah UPDATE 1: 18 August 2022



EMERGENCY EVENT TRACKING Data collection: 7 August 2022

The DTM Emergency Event Tracking (EET) is deployed to track sudden displacement and population movements, provide more frequent updates on the scale of displacement, and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the new Mobility Tracking methodology in Sudan (Round Four), and activated on a need basis, EET utilises a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population presence per location - a useful tool for humanitarian response planning and

## **Event Overview**





Displaced

DTM teams activated EET to monitor the displacement of individuals affected by heavy rains and flooding in locations across Al Managil locality, Al Jazirah state on 12 August 2022. Affected locations included Al-Amara Lekilik, Al-Shelikha Alawad, Kamp Altwalia, Um Talha Algadima, Burghul, Aldar Albida, Hafeer Hamada, and Hai Alnasr. The first EET update estimates that a total number of 580 individuals (97 households) are currently displaced in Algantara area, a high area near Burghul village in Al Manaqil locality, Al Jazirah. The entire IDP caseload (100%) was displaced from Kambo Burghul neighbourhood in Burghul village in Al Manaqil, Al Jazirah state.

DTM field teams have confirmed that no individuals were killed or injured. Additionally, there are no reported lost goods, livestock, cattle. All displaced individuals are nationals. At least 20 cases of additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support were identified by key informants through DTM's Protection Indicator. Additionally, DTM Sudan estimates that there are approximately 87 persons with disabilities among the IDP caseload.\* Based on a ranking scale, the three priority needs across the caseload are Emergency Shelter, Non-Food Items, and Food.





Data collected through the return intention indicator estimates that 580 individuals (100%) intend to remain in their current locations of displacement.


