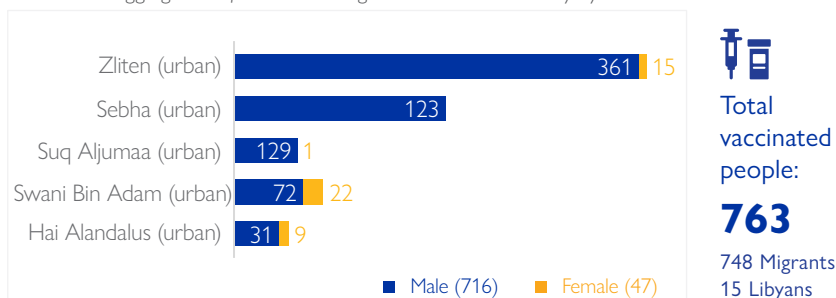


# IOM LIBYA WEEKLY MIGRANT & HOST COMMUNITIES COVID-19 VACCINATION UPDATE - PHASE 3 (21 - 27 Aug 2022)

As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM and NCDC conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 2,487 adult migrants (2,448 males and 39 females) in urban settings in five municipalities.

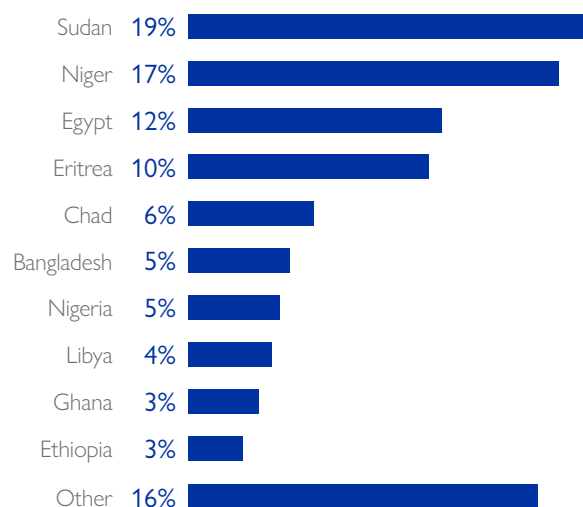
Additionally, 763 (748 migrants and 15 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in urban settings in five municipalities during the reporting period (21 - 27 Aug 2022).

Gender disaggregation of vaccinated migrants & host community by location



By 27 August 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 40 different countries of origin, including Sudan (19%), Niger (17%) and Egypt (12%).

By 27 August 2022, a total of 17,875 persons (1,311 females and 16,564 males) including 17,209 migrants and 666 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,586 people (20%) have received two doses and 775 (4%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
