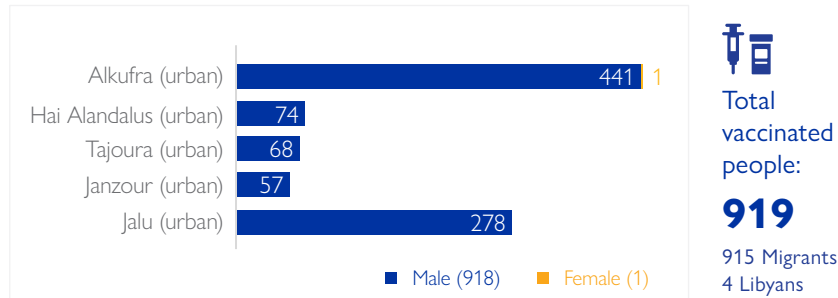


As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM and NCDC conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 2,353 adult migrants (2,334 males and 19 females) in urban settings in five municipalities.

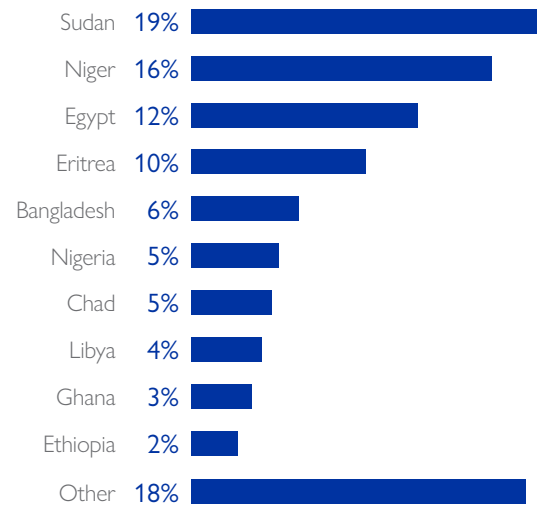
Additionally, 919 (915 migrants and 4 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in community settings in five municipalities during the reporting period (14 - 20 Aug 2022).

Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location

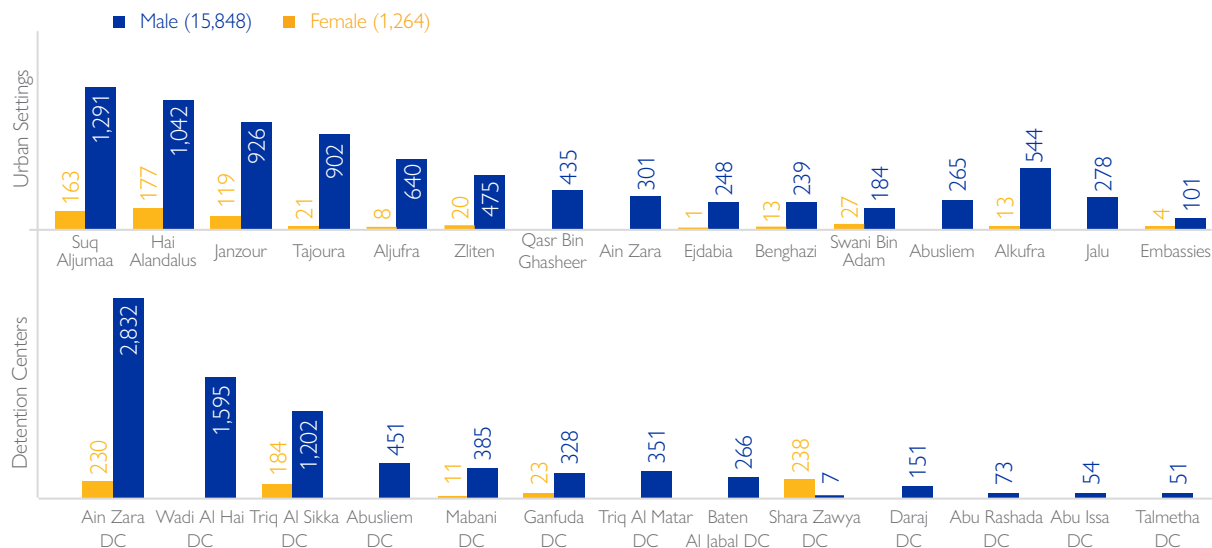


By 20 August 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 41 different countries of origin, including Sudan (19%), Niger (16%) and Egypt (12%).

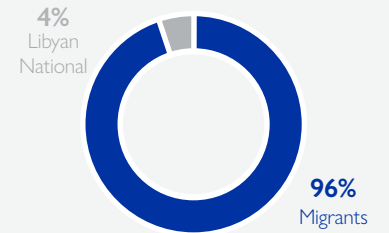
Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated



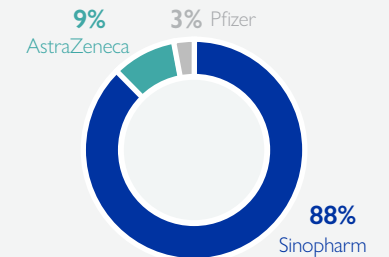
By 20 August 2022, a total of 17,112 persons (1,264 females and 15,848 males) including 16,461 migrants and 651 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,413 people (20%) have received two doses and 763 (4%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
